Dedicate New Anglican Church in Burlington

Last Tuesday the dedication of St. Christopher's Church, Burlington, took place with a large number in attendance; so large that standing room was the order of the night for many. St. Christopher's was mothered by St. Luke's Church, Burlington, and has since grown into a fine young healthy daughter. The Rt. Rev. W. E. Baghall, D.D., Bishop of the Diocese completed the act of dedication and delivered a sermon on the Faith and Power that made the church strong.

During the evening on behalf of some eighteen of the Hamilton area laymen who wished to remain anonymous \$7,000 was presented to the churchwardens, and \$1,000 was presented to St. Christopher's by the Mother Church of St. Luke's, Burlington by the rector, the Rev. C. Heathcote. The new congregation presented the new and first rector with a classical cloak. It was the first time in Diocesan history that a new church has been dedicated and has had its first rector inducted at the same time.
