United Church Moderator Tells Presbytery of Growth Challenge

At the recent meeting of Halton Presbytery of the United Church of Canada, held at Waterdown, Rev. J. W. Stewart, chairman, presided. The meeting was attended by 20 ministers and 16 lay delegates with several visitors being made corresponding members.
Dr. J. M. Miller, Cooksville, led in morning devotions giving an informative report on Channel of Spiritual Power, a missionary booklet.
During the business session of the meeting, Presbytery concurred, in the call of the Rev. M. W. J. Waters, B.A., B.D., Victoria, B.C., to the Port Nelson pastoral charge.
The court was addressed by Rev. J. S. Fiddes, formerly of the Bronte-Palermo charge, and now Hamilton Conference Archives convener, giving a review of the work of the Archives Committee of Conference, emphasizing the necessity of depositing old and valuable records in the archives at Victoria College for safe-keeping and for easy access for future reference.
General Council set up new regulations stressing that each Presbytery have a good active committee formed to deal specifically with archives. Mr. Fiddes stressed the influence of the living past, as being essential for the days to come, including treasured dates of important records of church buildings, etc.
Rev. J. A. Terry, Oakville, missionary and maintenance convener, gave a report of his committee, showing that 1954 returns had fine advances on the givings of 1953. A target objective of \$23,000 for Halton Presbytery M and M for 1955 was accepted.
In the absence of Evangelism and Social Service convener, Rev. I. G. Stapleton, Streetsville, dealt with the matter of inaugurating the National Evangelistic Mission within bounds of the Presbytery.
Rev. J. B. Moore announced the 23rd International Sunday School convention will be held in Cleveland from July 27-31. Seventy delegates have been allotted to the Hamilton Conference.
Rev. H. F. Currie of Carlisle was appointed supervising minister of the Lowville pastoral charge.
Reporting on the proposed plan to have Emmanuel College students preach on the pastoral charges of the Presbytery, Dr. C. D. Jay, Trafalgar, moved that the date for this plan be March 20th.
Halton Presbytery welcomed the visit of the moderator, the Very Rev. G. W. Dorey, D.D., and listened with keen appreciation to the challenging message which he brought to the meeting on the growth of the church compared with the growth of Canada, revealing the census changes which have seriously affected schools and churches. Between Queen Charlotte Islands and Newfoundland there are three million United Church members.
Taking into account Canada's growing international importance among the nations, Dr. Dorey dealt with the function of the church as it faces the steady challenge of secularism. Dr. Dorey exhorted all to exalt the church and recognize our duty, responsibility and privilege to help the underprivileged and underfed areas of the world from the highest motive possible, that of seeing our Lord and Master, Jesus Christ.
In the face of the challenge to overseas work by other religions, we

Ford Employees 4,300 Back in Production

Ford of Canada, on the floor for four months due to a dispute with the UAW, representing its 2,700 hourly-rated employees, is back in the thick of it, swinging with both production and sales. As of this week, there are 3,600 hourly-rated employees on its payroll and another 700 working in the office in the Oakville assembly plant. The total of 4,300 compares with 3,400 before the layoffs for the changeover last fall.
Shut down until the second week in February, Ford is making a rapid production comeback, too. Its augmented working force turned out a

total of 2,024 units the week ended February 26th.

Of these, 1,764 were passenger cars and 260 trucks. For the calendar year to date, Ford-Oakville has assembled 3,784 cars and 902 trucks. During this period, the industry made 53,806 cars and 5,845 trucks. Percentage-wise Ford made 7.1 per cent of the cars; 15.4 per cent of the trucks; and 8.3 per cent of the total vehicles.
For last week, however, Ford's share jumped to 21.6 per cent of cars, 44.7 per cent of trucks and 13.1 per cent of the total.
