The guest preachers for the day were two members from the faculty of the Divinity School of McMaster University, namely the Rev. Paul Rowntree Chifford, professor of Homiletics and Pastoral Theology who preached at the morning worship and the Rev. Harold Lang, professor of New Testament at the evening serv-

Rev. A. J. Barker conducted the services for the day. Mr. Clifford chose for his text Jer. 1:56 "Before I Formed Thee in the Belly I Knew Thee, and before Thou camest forth out of the womb I sanctified Thee and ordained thee a - prophet unto the nations, then said I, sh Lord God, behold I cannot speak for I am a child," which is speaking of our calling in life. God's purpose for Jesus began before be was born into the world and when he came, he fulfilled that purpose that God had planned for him. We too, were all born to fulfill a purpose and until we hear God's call to his survice we have not received the real meaning of our life. To aid ourselves to find the right calling we should (1) look at our gifts, (2) consider the opportunities, (3) having found there is a definite call discover just where the call lies. ...

In the evening Mr. Lang took his text from 2 Cor. 5 20 - "Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech you by us, we pray you in Christ stead be ye reconciled to God. In the cross of Christ enemies can be reconciled. There is a great need for the ministry of reconciliation in the world today. He stressed the fact that each Christian can be an ambassador for Christ and draw men together to Jesus Christ through the teaching and preaching of the Gospel.

The choir under Mrs. Walter Townend's direction sang as their anthems "O Sacred Head Now Wounded" and "The Galilean Pilot."

Shelve Manor Addition For Boarding Plan

There will be no addition to the Halton Centennial Manor this year, the Manor Board decided at a lengthy meeting last week. Instead it is planned to contribute towards the keep of older citizens in private homes.

"We decided that new provincial regulations pertaining to maintenance of elderly people meant that the county would have to pay 50 cents a day toward their keep, compared to a cost of about \$2 a day at the Manor," explained Reeve J. F. Haldenby. "So be will be in money by boarding them

in private homes. Another reason for the decision was the rejection by the Welfare Department of plans to add 18 beds to the Manor. The department termed the plans "too elaborate."
