A. G. M. Bruyns Leader in Dutch Immigration

Thirty years ago when Georgetown was a much smaller town which seemed far away from Toronto and Guelph, there arrived in the town a Dutch immigrant and his family.
 Though he came here to buy a farm, his knowledge of the country and the Canadian people was much broader than that of the average immigrant.
 Alexander G. M. Bruyns, 78, who died last Wednesday in Guelph General Hospital, got his captain's ticket at the age of 27 after eleven years at sea. Through ill health suffered in the tropics, he was forced to change his vocation. The change was complete, as he switched from the sea to agriculture.

He soon became interested in land reclamation and colonization, which projects he pursued on a large scale in Holland and in the West Indies. He branched out businesswise, and was appointed to the board of directors of various large companies and a bank. He was secretary of the Congress of Agricultural Economics and the editor of its publication, secretary of the Economic Geographic Society and a collaborator of the magazine.

In the early twenties, through his travels and observation of conditions in Europe, he became convinced that Holland with its very small land area too densely populated, had to start a program of migration in order to feed its population. And what better country could they come to than the land of the future, Canada. Accordingly he founded the Holland Emigration League and became its vice president and managing director.

After settling on a farm at Limehouse, now owned by Edgar Beene, he built up a herd of Holstein cattle that astounded the experts with its record of over 4% cream content for the herd. The progeny of the herd in later years went on to bring the highest prices in Canada and the States, one bull selling for \$50,000.

At Limehouse, he was a public spirited citizen, being interested among other things in the local school board and serving as vice president of Halton Milk Producers Association.
 He retired to Georgetown in 1937 and had since lived at 33 Charles St. He was a member of Credit Masonic Lodge.

District Jerseys Win Ton of Gold Honours

A Ton of Gold has been awarded to Avonlea Basil's Zana, 189168, from the Jersey herd of Featherstone Bros., Oakville. In 1461 days Zana produced 2,225 lbs. of fat. Her classification is Very Good and she is a daughter of the Superior Sire Brampton Jersey Basil. To qualify for this award a cow must produce 2,000 lbs. of fat in 4 consecutive years.

Another Jersey cow owned by Kenneth L. Ella at Hornby has been awarded a Ton of Gold certificate. In 1355 days Sunnycrest Lorna, 182529 has produced 2,098 lbs. of fat. Lorna is a daughter of the Superior Sire Wendybrook Warrior, 103471.
 Brampton WR Bijou Finn, 107814, an outstanding Jersey cow, has in 1291 days won a Ton of Gold award, producing in that time 2,177 lbs. of fat. Her senior four-year record of 761 lbs. of fat won her a Silver, Gold and Medal of Merit, and now her senior five year record of 15,871 lbs. of milk and 835 lbs. of fat wins her another Gold and Medal of Merit certificate. Pinn's classification is Excellent and she is a daughter of the Superior Sire Brampton World's Records. She was bred and is owned by B. H. Bull & Sons, Brampton.

Surviving are his wife, Agnes M. Lee, three sons, Anton in Indonesia, Jacob of Weston and Dr. Alexander of Alberta; and two brothers, Maurits and Anton, both in Holland.
