Scout camp has not yet been decided, but there will be news soon. If it is Kenabi, each boy must have Second Class, so how about it, fellows?

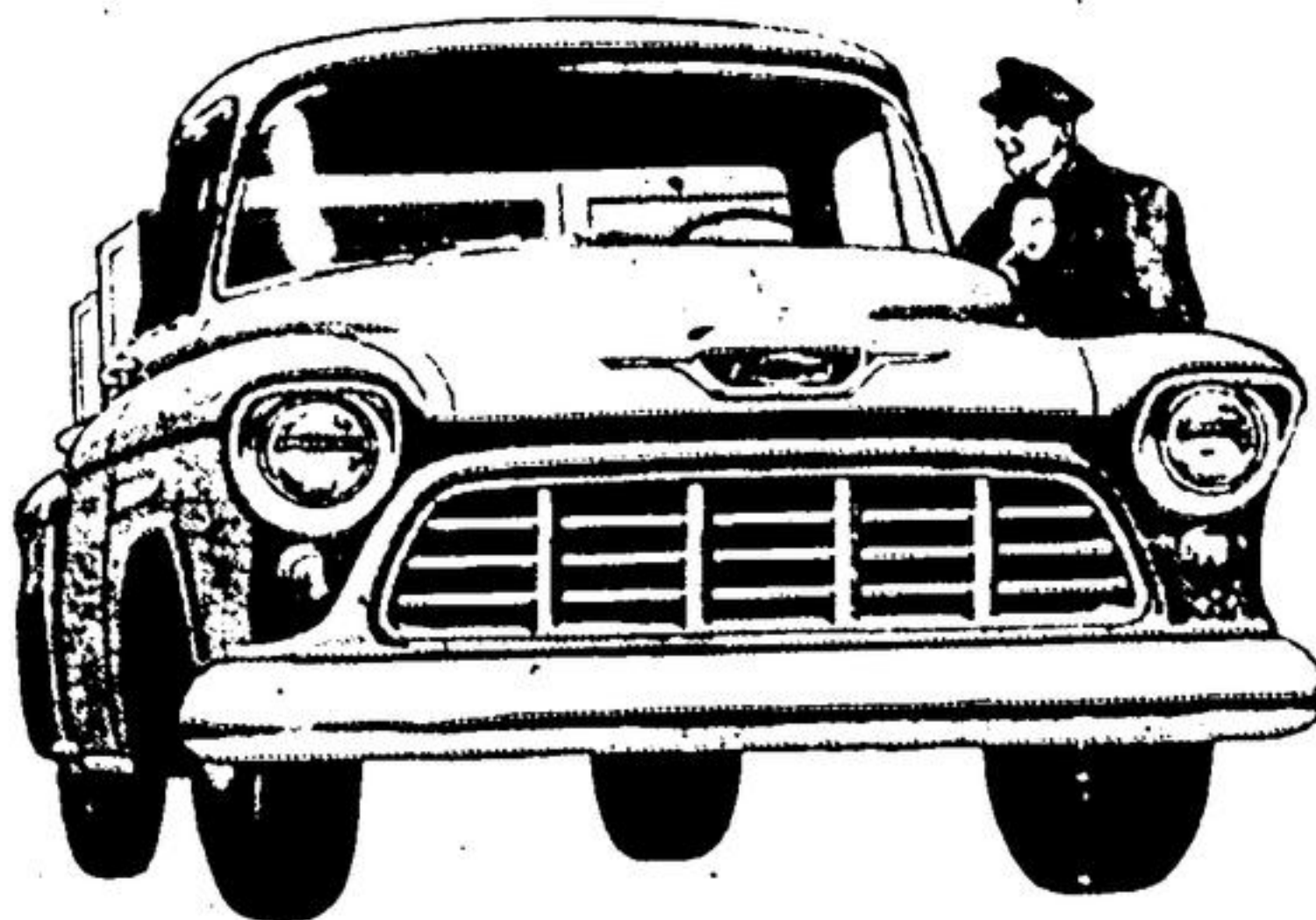
