

**Herald Editor Gives
Tips on News Writing**

Students from three junior classes at Wigglesworth School who plan to produce a school newspaper, were given some tips on news writing when Herald editor Walter Biehn spoke to them on Thursday.

Mr. Biehn advised the pupils to concentrate on their own field, as he tries to do in the Herald. "Look at your school as a town," he said, "and write only news which applies to your town and the people in it."

When writing stories, he told the pupils to keep the Five Ws in mind, and to make sure that each story had them — who, when, where, what, why.

Boys and girls from classes taught by Principal William Kinrade, Miss Marion Scarlett and Mrs. W. Gwizdala heard the talk. The school paper will be undertaken by Mrs. Gwizdala's class, and funds will be used for an educational tour which they will take later this spring.

The students were also invited to make a tour of the Herald shop, and this is being arranged for an afternoon after Easter.

**New Layoffs at Malton
Mean 3,000 Out of Work**

W. R. McLachlan, vice president and general manager of Orenda Engines, Ltd., Malton, one of the Avro Canada companies, said Monday that about 1,000 of the 6,500 employees of his firm would likely be laid off this summer.

He said the "stretchout" of CF-100 aircraft production announced last week "necessitates an adjustment in production of Orenda jet engines." Layoffs would take place in July, he said.

Layoffs at Orenda would bring to a total of 3,000 the number of men involved in the slowdown program of CF-100 production.

Last week Avro Aircraft announced that 1,000 men will be laid off in May, June, and July. In January the same firm released another 1,000 men.

Several Georgetown residents left the company's employ in January and it is certain that the two latest moves will affect a considerable number more of local people. It is estimated that over 300 Georgetowners are employed at the plant which until January had a 10,000 working force.

The cut in production is caused by a government decision to take delivery of CF-100s for the RCAF over a two year longer period.

The company is holding out some hope that at least a portion of the workers will be rehired when production starts on the new supersonic CF-105.

A company statement said: "It is felt appropriate to point out that employment is being increased on the CF-100 project, particularly in the engineering division and the tooling departments, and it is hoped this will result in increased activity in the near future."

Avro recently hired fifty additional engineers and is seeking another 150.
