

Senior Executive Appointments Announced By Ontario Hydro

Reorganization of Ontario Hydro's senior management and engineering group, including the appointment of four Assistant General Managers, has been recently announced by the Commission. Designed to permit a more effective flow of executive functions, the redistribution of duties places the overall administration of the Commission's affairs in the hands

of the General Manager, A. W. Manby. The Chief Engineer, Dr. Otto Holden, is directly responsible to the Commission for the completion of the vast Niagara and St. Lawrence power projects.

In the new organization, there are four Assistant General Managers reporting to the general manager. The Assistant General Manager-Engineering, George D. Floyd, is responsible for the planning, Engineering, Construction and Research Divisions. The Assistant General Manager-Administration, J. Mervyn Hambley, is responsible for Operations, Consum-

er Service, Regions, Frequency Standardization, Security and the A. W. Manby Service Centre, Ialington. The Assistant General Manager and Comptroller, E. Harold Banks, is responsible for Treasury, Accounting, Supply, Property and Organization. The Assistant General Manager-Personnel, John Dibblee, is responsible for the Collective Relations, Medical Services, Wage and Salary Administration, Employee Relations and Accident Prevention.

The Director of Information, James A. Blay, and the newly appointed legal counsel Lorne R. McDonald, QBE, QC, also report directly to the general manager.

Responsible to the chief engineer, Dr. Holden, will be Gordon Mitchell, director, St. Lawrence Power Project, and W. L. Fraser, project manager. Sir Adam Beck - Niagara Generating Station No. 2.

G. D. Floyd, assistant general manager engineering, was born in Nova Scotia. He obtained a bachelor of science degree (in Arts) from Dalhousie University in 1913 and, two years later, a Bachelor of Science degree in electrical engineering from McGill University. After two years' post graduate work, he enlisted in the Royal Flying Corps, serving in Scotland and England from 1917 to 1919. Joining Ontario Hydro in 1919 as assistant Laboratory Engineer, Mr. Floyd later transferred to the Electrical Engineering Department. In 1930, he moved to the newly formed Planning Section, Electrical Engineering Department, and in 1940 was appointed System Planning Engineer. With the formation of the Planning Division three years later, he was named its first director. Mr. Floyd is a vice president of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers. His other affiliations include membership in the Engineering Institute of Canada, Canadian Electrical Association, the Electrical Club of Toronto, and the Association of Professional Engineers of Ont.

J. M. Hambley, assistant general manager administration, joined the Hydro in 1930 as an assistant engineer in the operating department, serving the Georgian Bay system and Northern Ontario properties. In 1945 he was appointed district operating engineer for the Abitibi, Sudbury, Nipissing, Timiskaming, and Manitoulin Districts. Two years later, he was named director of operations of the Commission.

Born at Copper Cliff, Ontario, Mr. Hambley received his primary and secondary school education at Copper Cliff and Sudbury. Employment for a year in the International Nickel Company smelter at Copper Cliff preceded four years at Queen's University, from which he graduated in 1929 with the degree of Bachelor of Science, Electrical Engineering. Following graduation he spent a year with the Canadian General Electric Company at Peterborough and Toronto before joining Ontario Hydro. Always displaying a special interest in the human relations aspect of management, he was the Commission's first entrant in the University of Western Ontario's Management Training course which he attended during the summer of 1952. Mr. Hambley is a member of the Association of Professional Engineers of Ontario, the American Institute of Electrical Engineers, and the Toronto Board of Trade.

E. Harold Banks, assistant general manager and comptroller, was born in Wolverhampton, England, and joined the Commission in 1947 as comptroller. He received his early education in Montreal. Mr. Banks obtained his degree as chartered accountant from McGill University in 1934, while employed by a Montreal firm of chartered accountants, with whom he remained until 1941, when he joined Defence Industries Ltd., holding various offices including that of comptroller. From 1946 to 1947, he was secretary treasurer of Atlas Steels, Ltd. Mr. Banks is a member of the Toronto Board of Trade.

John Dibblee, assistant general manager - personnel joined hydro in 1917 and has served continuously with the exception of a 10-month period with the Royal Air Force during World War I. Born in Woodstock, N.B. he attended the University of Toronto from which he graduated with the degree of Bachelor of Applied Science. Before joining Hydro, he gained valuable experience as a foreman on many jobs, while he had also been a demonstrator in hydraulics at the University's School of Practical Science, and a resident engineer with Kerry and Chase.

His early employment with Hydro was as station design engineer. Following his RAF service, he became district operating engineer for the Commission's former Eastern Ontario System - a position he held until 1928 when he was appointed General Superintendent for the Niagara Falls District. In 1931, Mr. Dibblee was named Hydro's assistant chief operating engineer and six years later became assistant chief engineer. In 1945 he was called upon to take over the duties of chief engineer, operations. As manager of Personnel, Mr. Dibblee has contributed in large measure to the successful negotiating of Commission employee agreements including those covering construction workers on Hydro power projects. He is president of the Labour Relations Association, St. Lawrence Power Project, and a Fellow of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers.
