**School Growth Continues  
Plan Another Two Rooms**

With the local school population growing each week, another 3-room addition is in the planning process for Wigglesworth public school.

The school board received approval for the addition from council last week and tomorrow night will discuss plans with a representative of J. B. Parkin Associates, the firm of architects which planned the original building and the 4-room addition completed last fall.

Last week the board engaged two new teachers to increase the teaching staff in September to an all time record of 22.

Harold Catling of Ingersoll, presently teaching at the Springfield RCAF School near Aylmer will become assistant to principal William Kinrade at Wigglesworth School. Mr. and Mrs. Catling and their young son will move here this summer.

Mrs. Shirley Borland, who is moving with her husband to Georgetown, will teach a new class being created at Chapel Street School. Mrs. Borland is not teaching this year, and last taught at Collingwood.

An extra classroom at Chapel Street will mean use of the music room full-time again. At Wigglesworth, if the addition cannot be completed by September, new classes will be temporarily housed in the auditorium.

With the town growing so fast, it is possible that still another classroom may have to be found at Chapel, and the board is considering moving the kindergarten room to another location if this is found necessary.

**Special Activities Mark  
Annual St. George's Day**

During this coming week end the congregation of St. George's will mark the anniversary of their patron saint, St. George. On Friday afternoon the Woman's Auxiliary will hold a tea to mark the occasion from two to five o'clock.

On Saturday morning the men of the Church propose to hold a work party and do a spring cleaning of the church lawn and repairs to the church property. A service of the Holy Communion in thought and honour of St. George will be held in the church at 10 a.m., the men in the work party being invited to attend in their work clothes, a witness that the Christian religion is a practical everyday religion.

On Sunday, the men of St. George's Chapter of the Brotherhood of Anglican Churchmen will officiate at the morning service of Matins at 11 a.m. The sermon will be preached by Ernie Barnes, Ballinacree, the scripture lessons will be read by Michael Armstrong and David Hart. During the service many men of the brotherhood will have a part and the rector will install the officers of the chapter. On Tuesday, April 26th, the Brotherhood will hold their annual St. George's Day banquet in the parish house of the church basement at seven o'clock. A good programme is planned for the evening.

**Romandale Herd Has  
Twelve Top Holsteins**

During the recent official Selective Registration grading of the Romandale Farms herd of Holsteins maintained by S. B. Roman at Gormley, Ontario, four head were classified "Excellent" and seven Very Good. This brings the number of "Excellent" cows in the Romandale herd to ten. Few herds in Canada have ever had four animals graded "Excellent" at once and few have had as many as ten "Excellent" cows in the herd at one time. During the past year only thirty-two Holsteins in the entire Dominion were graded "Excellent" which calls for a score of at least 90 out of 100 points for bodily conformation.

Aside from their "Excellent" grading, each of this quartet is a noted individual. One is Mahoney Babe Lochinvar, with a yearly record on three times-a-day milking of 26,321 lbs. of milk and 117 lbs. fat (4.24 per cent); another is Kneland Farm Annabel, who received Honorable Mention for All-Canadian Aged Cow last year after being second at the Royal and Reserve Champion and Best Uddered female at the CNE; the third is Elm-croft Adeen May, Grand Champion at Peterboro Championship Show, and Honorable Mention All-Canadian three year old in 1952; and the fourth is Rosehill Governess Wayne, daughter of the famous Rosehill Fayne Wayne, who was Grand Champion at the Royal Winter Fair and All-Canadian Aged Cow in 1946, and three times All-American Aged Cow.

Graded Very Good on her first class-achievement, an honour that is seldom achieved, was Texal Pond Hope Darkie, the All-Canadian two year old of 1954, and the Reserve All-Canadian Junior Yearling of 1953.

Darkie was bred by Joseph Robinson, Richmond Hill, Ontario; Rosehill by Nelson Bechtel, Hespeler, Ontario; Adeen by G. R. McLaughlin, Oakawa, Ont.; Annabel by B. M. Neelands, Hornby, Ont.; and Mahoney Babe Lochinvar by Independent Coal and Lumber Co., of Ottawa.

George M. VanPatter, official Selective Registration inspector for the Holstein-Friesian Association of Canada, who graded the Romandale herd, was loud in his praise of this herd terming it one of the best he had been privileged to grade. He especially commended herdsman Dave Houck for the splendid manner in which the herd was maintained.
