

**IGA TAKES CASE TO COURT OF APPEAL**

Still seeking to break the town store closing by-law, IGA Store owners Bob Caldwell and Bruce Williamson have appealed the court verdict which fined them \$25 each for remaining open in defiance of the by-law.

Monday, Mr. Justice Gibson granted leave to appeal and the case will come before the next sitting of the Ontario Court of Appeal in June.

Originally convicted by Magistrate Hollinrake in Newmarket in February, IGA appealed through their lawyers, Downey & Shand, and the case was heard again in Milton, with Judge G. W. Morley upholding the verdict.

The appeal was granted Monday on a point of law and the town's solicitors, Hewson & Ord did not oppose the application.
