**Vaccine Now Available  
For County Grade Threes**

Grade 3 children in Halton will receive their first inoculation of polio vaccine during the week of May 9th, and four weeks later their second injection.

In Esqueping, the same days in Ashgrove Sunday School; and in Nassageweys, May 13 and June 17 in Campbellville School.
