**Anglican Rector Attends  
Servers' Conference**

Recently at St. Jude's Church, Oakville, over two hundred young men and boys representing many parishes of the Diocese of Niagara held their third annual conference and ninth rally.

The young alymen were welcomed by the Rector Canon F. C. Jackson, rector of the host parish. Following the dinner the annual business meeting was held and the Biennial election of officers took place. The new slate are president Ronald Hunt, St. Augustine of Canterbury, Hamilton; president Raham Shoemith, Church of the Redeemer, Stoney Creek; Jack Wilson, secretary-treasurer of St. Mark's Church, Hamilton. The bishop named the Rev. Lorne Myers of St. Mark's, as his chaplain for 1958-59. The servers were led in devotions by Rev. M. Creal of Winona and were billeted by generous parishioners of Oakville who provided accommodation for the many boys who stayed overnight.

The Friday was one of numerous activity. The Diocesan chaplain Rev. K. Richardson, celebrated the Holy Communion, assisted by Can. F. Jackson and the Rev. M. Lafferty of St. Jude's. The servers were classified in two groups, public school and senior group of high school and vocational young men. Group 1 was ably led by the Rev. C. Raymond of St. Timothy's Church, Hamilton, and the senior group was under the direction of the Rev. J. C. Pricker of Hamilton. The lecture course dealt with the duties and the call of the young laymen in the life and work of the church.

The noonday devotion were conducted by Server Lyman Harding of St. George's, Hamilton. During the afternoon the young men were privileged to tour the Ford plant at Oakville. Films on church work were shown throughout the conference by the director of Religious Education.

The banquet address was delivered by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, the Rt. Rev. W. E. Bagnall, D.D., who spoke to the young men informally, but instructively, urging them to develop a sound sense of vocation and loyalty in their task which is Apostolic. In the evening the Rally Service was held in St. Jude's Church which was nearly completely filled with the young men. The Rev. M. Creal sang the service of Evensong, the president of the Niagara Diocesan Guild, Mr. Albert Andrews of Christ's Church Cathedral read the first lesson and Mr. John Mace, vice president, of St. Martin's Church, Niagara Falls, read the second lesson. Bartlett of St. Mark's, Orangeville, preached the sermon, outlining the ideal aims and objectives for a server. The Rev. The choir of St. Jude's, under the leadership of Mr. G. Evans rendered the liturgical music.

The conference is the most successful to be held in the history of the movement and represent a growth of a tremendous nature. The first Conference was held two years ago at Holy Trinity, Pontchartraine and last year at St. James, Port Colborne.

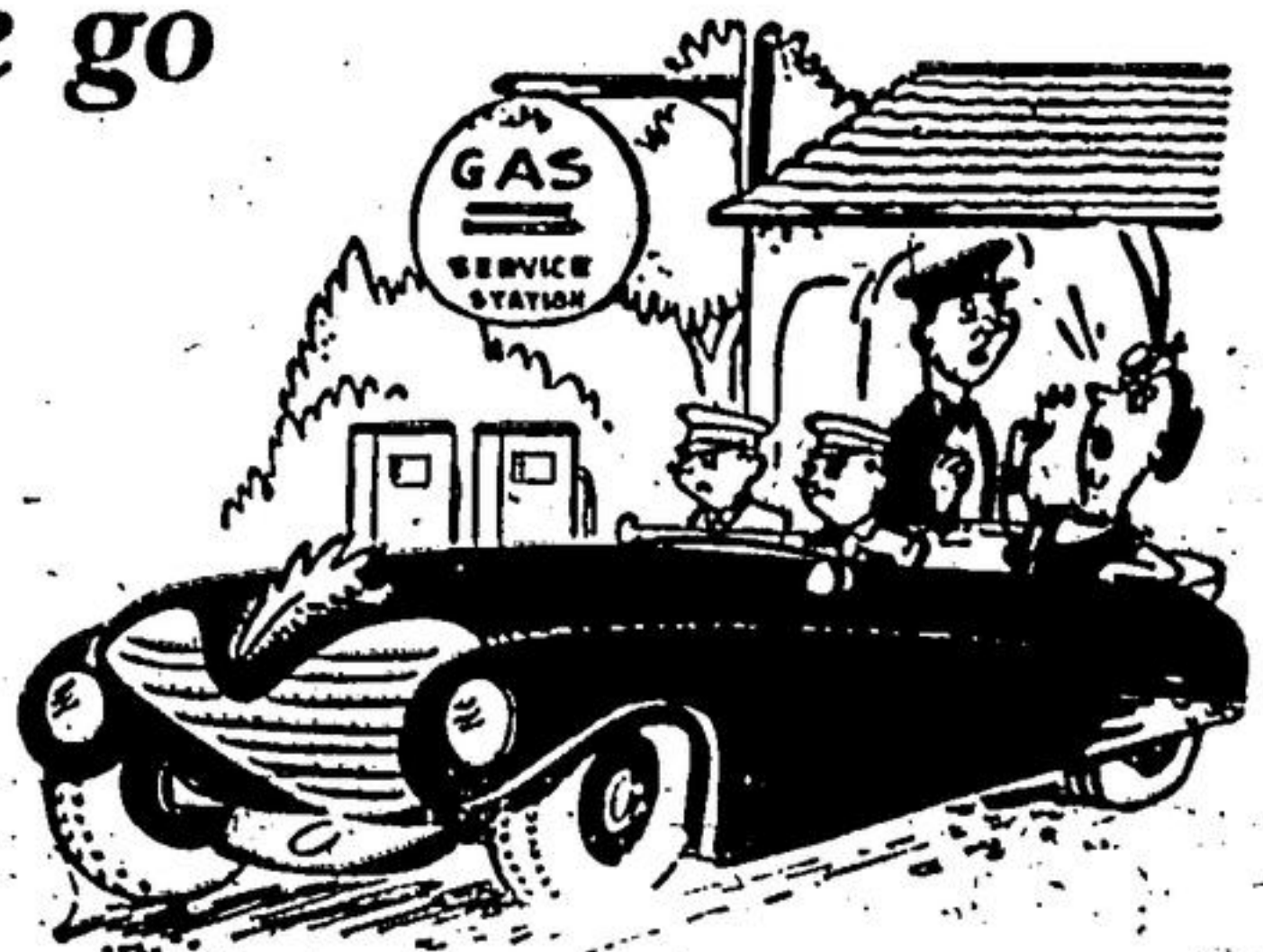
