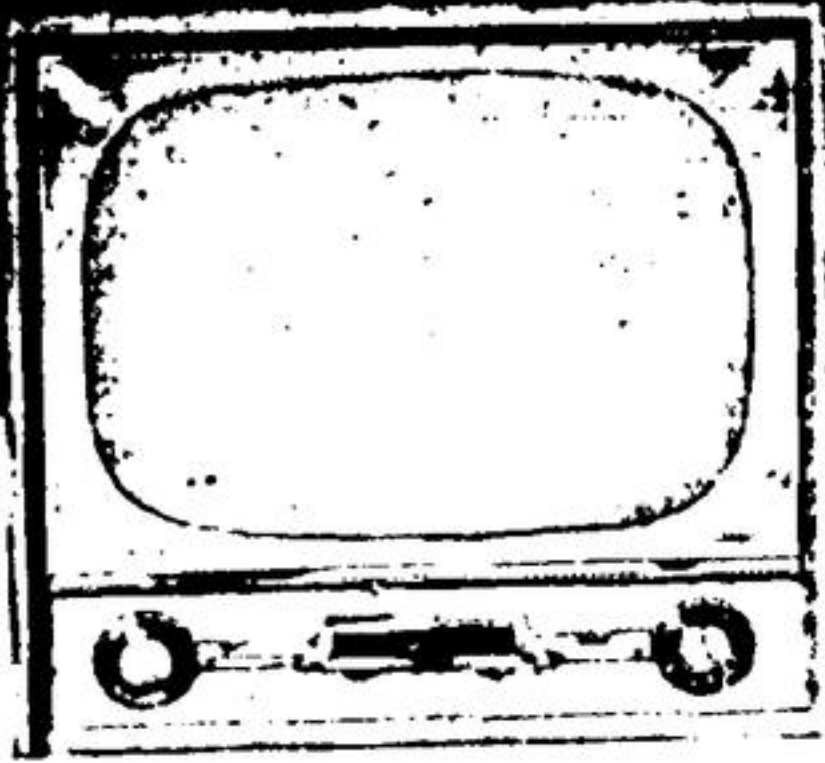

Last of Bradley Family**

Last surviving member of the family of James Bradley and Isabella Haaner, Mrs. Hugh MacDonald was buried in Oshawa on Saturday following a funeral service in Christ Memorial Church. She died in hospital on Thursday.

The former Iernis Bradley, she was born in Georgetown, youngest of a family of ten children. She had been seriously ill since November, 1953, when her brother, William F. Bradley, owner of the Dominion Seed House died. A sister, Mrs. George Bradshaw died in Seattle, Washington at that time also. Her father farmed on what is now the Cedarvale School property on lower Main St.

Mrs. MacDonald was married during the first war while she was serving as a nursing sister overseas. They had lived in Oshawa since that time.

She leaves her husband, who is also seriously ill in hospital, and two sons, John of Toronto and Donald of Oshawa.

**Daughter Was Former
Resident of Georgetown**

James Knox Boal, 66, who died last week in Toronto East General Hospital, was father of a former Georgetown resident, Mrs. Jim Baysarovich, who now lives in Victoria, B.C.

Mr. Boal, who lived at 295 Sackville St in the city was buried in Mount Pleasant Cemetery on May 4th following a funeral service at the Thompson Central funeral home. He was a member of Joshua Lodge No 154 and former member of the Independent Taxi Association.

He is survived by his wife, Catherine Crozier and five children, Mrs. H. Weaver, Mrs. D. Wilson, James, Mrs. J. Baysarovich (Violet) and James Crozier. Mr. and Mrs. Baysarovich lived in town while her uncle "Pop" Holmes operated the Corner Cupboard Restaurant, and worked with him in the business. **Arts, Crafts Sponsor
Leathercraft Show**

"Canadian Originals in Leather," the second travelling exhibition prepared by members of the Canadian Society of Creative Leathercraft, is now on tour, and will be shown in Georgetown public library, 4 to 6 p.m. on Thursday, May 19th, under auspices of Arts and Crafts of Georgetown. Silver collection. Light refreshments.

This display contains 95 pieces by 36 of Canada's leading craftsmen. All articles are of original design, and have been selected to illustrate particular points of design, technique, construction, coloring and craftsmanship. Several of the articles were shown in the Canadian Crafts Exhibition at the Toronto Art Gallery, in the second Canadian International Hobby and Homecraft Show in Toronto, in the Canadian National and Pacific National Exhibitions, and in the First International Assembly of Leathercraftsmen in Buffalo, N.Y. A number are prizewinners in the various 1953 and 1954 exhibitions.

Educational projects illustrating decorative and construction techniques are an important new feature of the present exhibition, and offer practical help to the leathercraftsman.

This exhibition has already been shown in a large number of Canadian centres.

"Canadian Handmade in Leather," the first travelling Exhibition of the Society was enthusiastically received wherever it was shown during the year and a half it was on tour, culminating in an invitation showing at the First International Handicrafts Show, held in London, England, where it was judged the best single display of the entire exhibition. Comments on the present display encourage members to feel that they have made considerable progress towards achieving their objective of developing a distinctive leathercraft design movement, which may in the course of time become recognized as "Canadian."
