WHAT COUNCIL DID

\$300,000 Water Debenture to Be Issued Soon

A \$300,000 expenditure for waterworks was given final approval Monday night by Georgetown council. A 41/2 per cent debenture issue, maturing in 20 years, will finance the

waterworks extension which is being engineered by Philips and Roberts. the consulting engineering firm which were overseers of the present waterworks system.

Much of the new system is due to the Delrex subdivision, for which Georgetown has agreed to supply water. Most costly item is a \$50,000 fes--ervoir to furnish storage not now avallable for surplus water. A trunk main along Maple Avenue to No. 7 Highway will cost \$35,000, Extension of this from there to the eastern town limits is assessed at \$24,000 and a line north to John Street \$18,000. A

new pump houe is valued at \$20,000. Tenders are already out for construction of the system which will be completed this year.

Asked to explain the garbage disposal system on the waterworks property, to which Cedarvale School had objected at the last meeting town foreman Ern Hyde said that bales of waste paper have now been covered and there is no objectionable material now in view.

Percy Harding, who has been operating the landfill machine, resigned this position last week, and Mr. Hyde was instructed to interview a man whom he thought was interested in the job. The new man will be engaged as an addition to the town works staff and the foreman will be in charge of assigning 'men to operate the machine.


