## Leather Originals Makes Interesting Library Show

Furthering the purpose for which they were organized "to encourage and develop handicrafts the Arts and Crafts of Georgetown presented "Canadian Originals in Leather" to the public. This is the second travelling exhibition prepared by members of the Canadian Society of Creative Leathercraft. After negotiating for many months this exhibition was held at the Public Library Thursday and was viewed with great interest by a large number of people.  
It consisted of ninety-five pieces by 36 of Canada's leading craftsmen among whom is one of the local members, Mrs. D. Lingwood of Caledon, exhibiting a corsage of beautiful leather flowers delicately tinted with colour.  
The articles were attractively displayed on two long tables. There were beautiful belts of various widths and colours, gloves, coaster sets that resembled mahogany wood, a tiny watch case, purses of all sizes and shapes to fill the heart of every woman with longing. One black and white purse with matching gauntlet gloves made of natural unshorn hide was especially original. A tooled leather gun belt with double holster would brighten the eyes of any small boy.  
One table held boxes of different sizes, beautifully embossed and lined, a large leather picture frame ornamented with pine cones, fur lined moccasins and a small clock with a leather frame. There were two large pictures made entirely of leather, one of an Eskimo mother and child and the other which drew especial attention showed a shopkeeper with a most humorous expression. One could almost see the twinkle in his eyes. This exhibition proved that leathercraft can be both useful and ornamental. It is a most fascinating hobby for men and women alike.

A silver collection was taken at the door to help defray expenses and the guests were served light refreshments. A business meeting preceded opening of the display: Mrs. Cyril Bradford was in the chair. An interesting resume of a meeting of the Weavers' Guild held in Toronto, was given by Mrs. Ern Batkin.
