There were minor phone interruptions on Friday while the work was being completed. This Sunday morning, hydro power will be off from 5 a.m. to 7 a.m. while changes are being made in the high tension line along the highway which feeds power to town and as far as Acton.

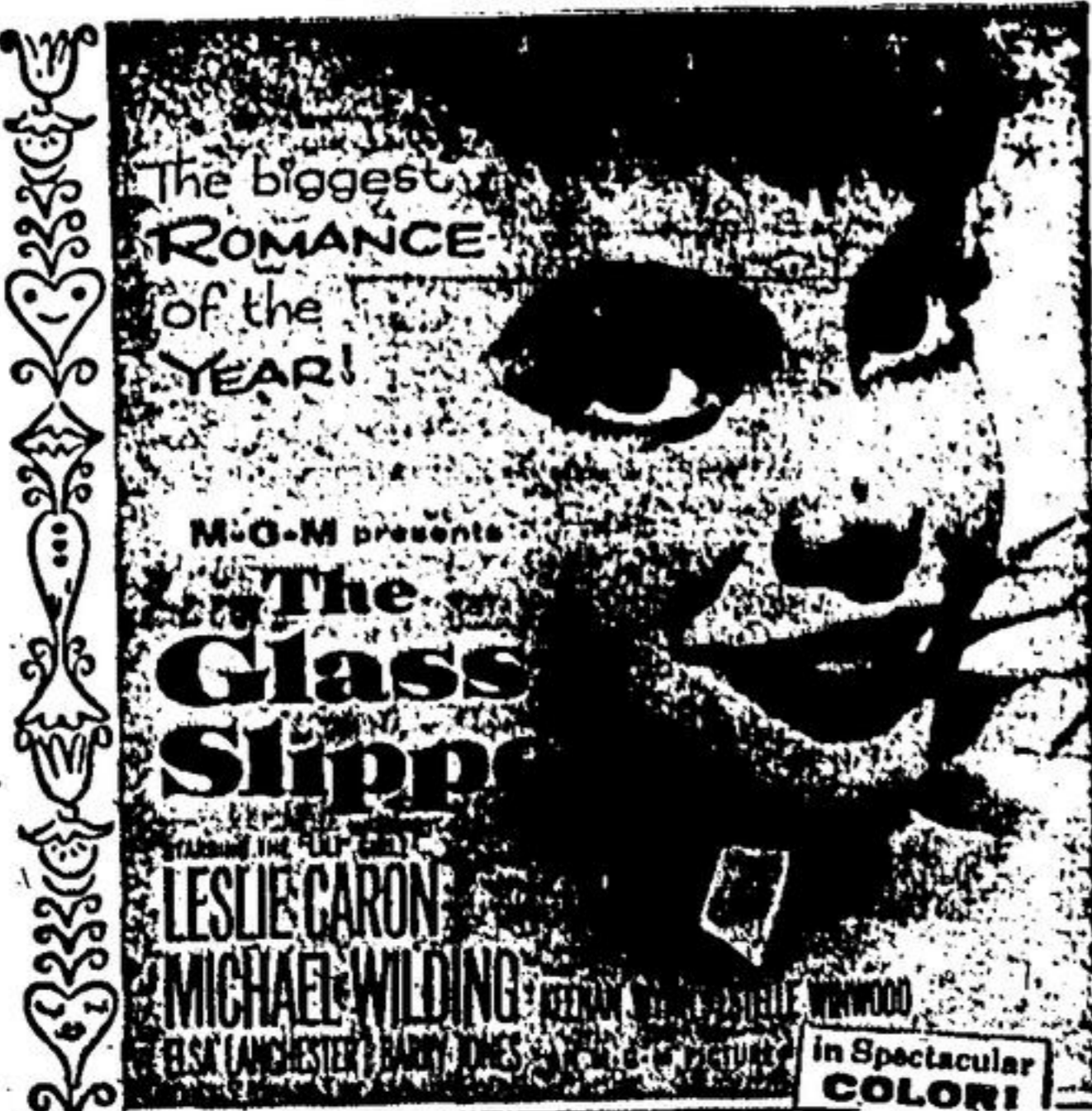
