WHAT COUNCIL DID

Storm Sewer Planned To Help King Street

An \$8,000 storm sewer system to relieve drainage conditions in an area bordered by King, Durham and McNabb Streets is contemplated by Georgetown Council.

Monday, council issued instructions to have a by-law prepared for this. For some time, council has received complaints, particularly from property owners on King St. that rainstorms cause damage and inconvenience to properties.

The proposed system would bring surface drainage from King, Elgin, Durham, and McNabb to the Emery-McNabb junction, emptying into the creek at that point.

Council decided to advertise further for a stenographer in the municipal office, trying ads in town, Milton and Acton papers. The position pays a salary of \$2200.

Mr. Francis, representing the Underwood Co. explained a tax billing machine which he suggests would be a useful addition to the town office.

A \$32,000 debenture by law to provide for the 2 room addition to Wrigglesworth School passed its first two readings.

A gentleman representing Dove Construction explained that two of 15 houses being built by him on Byron Street contravened the building by-law by 3,100th of a foot. He was given an okay to go ahead, with Reeve Allen and Crs. Sargent and Lyons objecting on a point of principle, though all agreed that in this case it would not be sensible to do anything but allow the infraction.

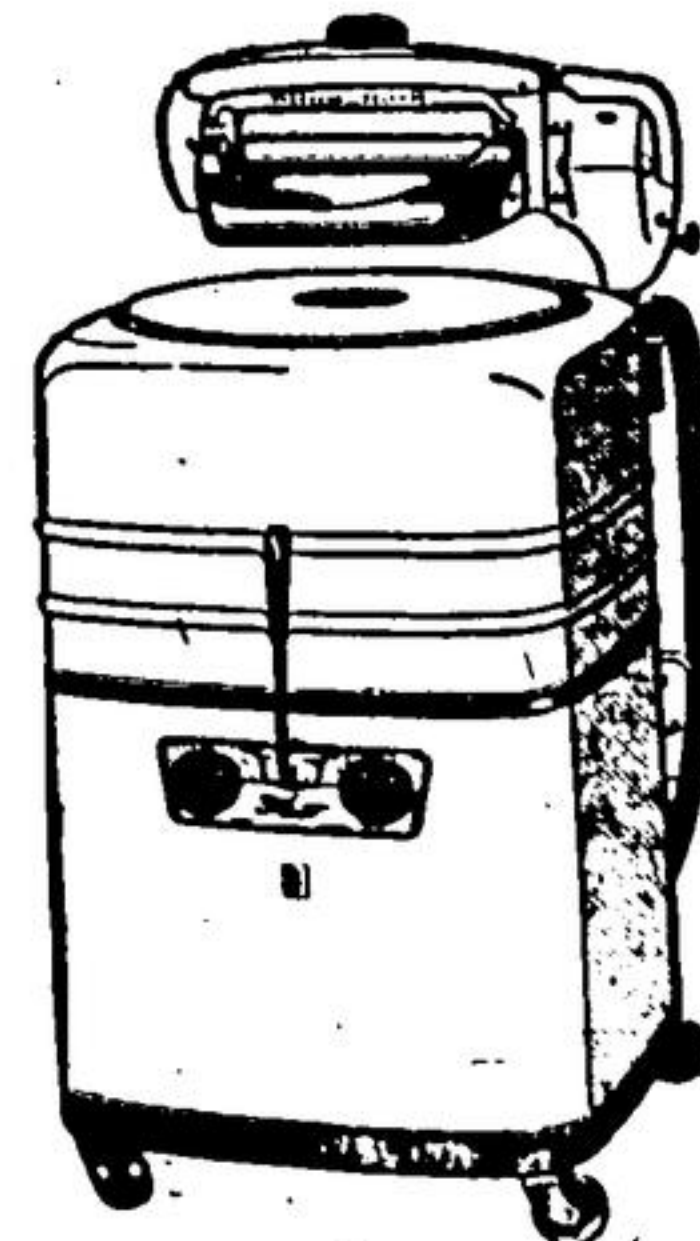
