Dr. Clifford Reid Transfers Dental Practice to Erin

A dentist in Georgetown for fifteen years, Dr. Clifford Reid is transferring his office to Erin and will open a new office there next month.
Dr. Reid has been living on a farm on the 7th Line, Erin Township north of Ballinafad for several years. Dr. and Mrs. Reid and her mother, Mrs. William Black will continue to make their home there while the doctor commutes to his practice.

Dr. Reid practiced in downtown Toronto on Yonge Street for several years before coming to town where he took over the office of the late Dr. Ben Gollop. Here the Reids have led an active community life. They have been active supporters of the hockey club of which the doctor is an honorary president, the Lorne Scots Band, of which he is also an honorary president, and in church work at St. George's Anglican Church.

One of their most worthwhile activities was with St. George's Boys' League, which met every Monday night at their home for five years. The club, which included boys of all religious denominations, stressed church attendance, sports and hobbies. In the summers Dr. and Mrs. Reid took the whole group to camp, in the winters they supervised hockey leagues and in the spring, baseball, while also developing hobbies such as model planes. There are many young men in town who still recall fondly the happy days provided by this generous couple.

Dr. Reid is a native of Niagara-on-the-Lake and a veteran of the first World War. He served overseas for three years.

He is a charter member of Halton Children's Aid Society and was one of the original directors when the county society was set up. He is a member of the Masonic lodge.

In moving to Erin, Dr. Reid says he does not like to feel he is leaving Georgetown where they have spent so many happy years. A combination of circumstances, including handiness of travel from their farm home, led to the decision to transfer his office, and he expects to frequently be back in town.
