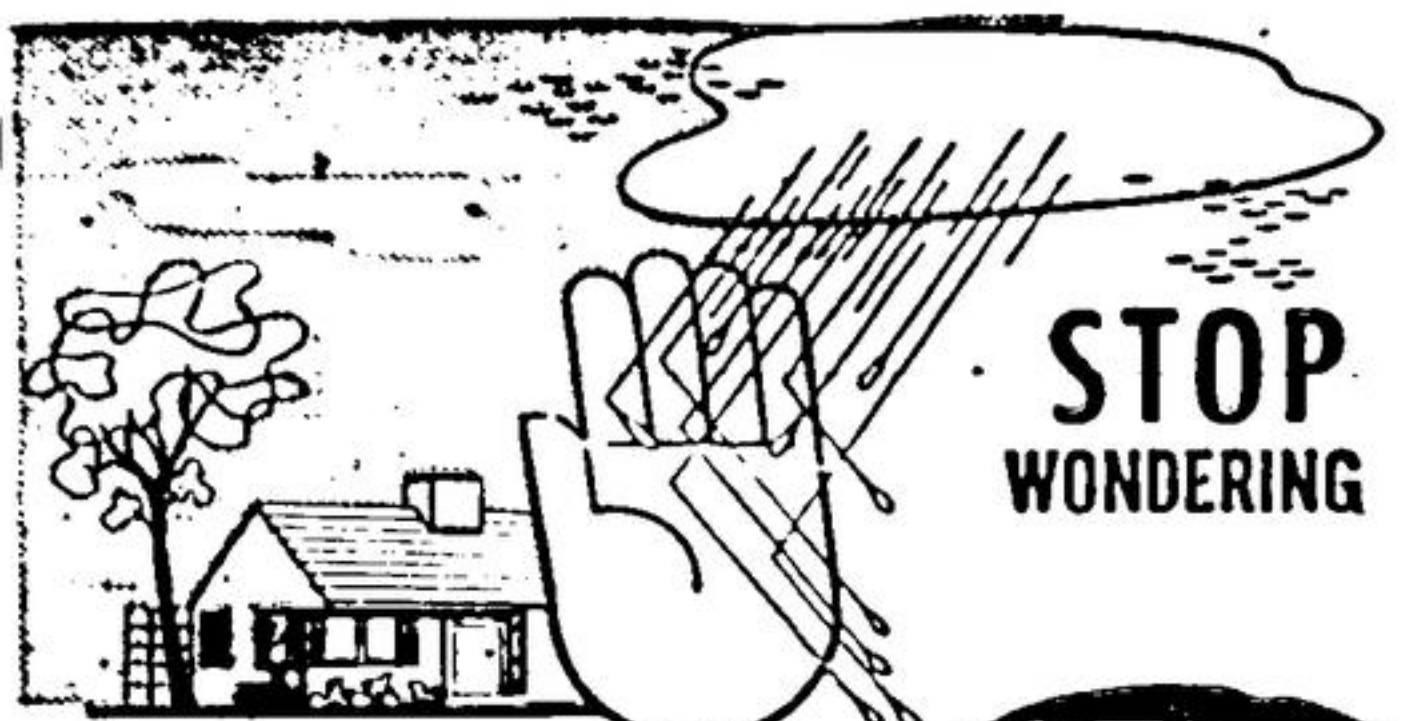

## Seek Another Constable Macleod Going Kitchener

Georgetown's new 4-man police force will be missing one face the end of the month.

Constable Alexander Macleod, newest member of the force, handed his resignation to council Monday, explaining that he had been accepted as a member of the police force in Kitchener at a much higher rate of pay. He had applied for this position at the same time as he did at Georgetown.

Council is advertising for a replacement. The position pays a starting salary of \$2700 for a probationary constable.

A \$250 grant was made to Esqueping Agricultural Society which operates Georgetown Fair, when treasurer Perry Cleave appeared to request a grant.

Ed Peters spoke for the new Boys Band, explaining that the band has a \$500 deficit and would like further support from the town treasury. A \$250 grant was made when the band was organized last spring.

Council was sympathetic, but Mayor Armstrong explained that it is illegal to give grants to bands without votes of the electors, and he would hesitate to act further on the request. Cr. McGillivray suggested that next fall, when the band is sufficiently advanced to play concerts, it might be possible to recompense them for services. The matter was left in abeyance until the fall.
