

Last member of a family whose Georgetown connections go back over a century, Charles Brown Dayloot, 90, died on July 5th at his resident, 2973 Youl Bay Road, Victoria, B.C.

Mr. Dayfoot, who was born in Georgetown was the son of John B. Dayfoot who emigrated to Canada from Vermont in 1838 and became one of Georgetown's early industrialists. Mr. Dayfoot was in business in Grimsby first, then in Hamilton. In 1845 he started a tannery here, later adding a shoe factory which was in charge of his brother Philo.

Twenty eyars later, John B. Dayfoot, moved permanently to Georgetown. When he died in 1802, his son Charles took over the business which remained in the Dayfoot name until it was sold in 1945. Alle was later joined by his brother flarry, who died

in April, 1964, as a partner. The firm, latterly known as C. B., Dayfost and Co. produced high grade work boots and ski shoes in their factory on John Street which is now used as part of the manufacturing operations of Dolphin Craft fiberglas

During his long residence here, Mr. Dayfoot served for years as a member of the high school board and was at one time chairman. He was an elder and a faithful member of St. John's United Church while his wife devoted much of her time to the work of the Women's Christian Temperance Union. Ten years ago, they sold their home on Market Street to Dr. E. G. Bishop and moved west.

He leaves this wife Catherine, his son Rev. Arthur C. Dayfoot, a United Church missionary in Trindidad, BWI, 3 grandchildren, and a niece, Mrs. P. K. Hambly, Toronto.
