

WHAY COUNCIL DID

Seek Better Drainage For Cloverdale Area

Council wrote Central Mortgage & Housing about installing storm sewers in Cloverdale Heights where surface drainage is coming down onto Churchill Crescent. The town refuses to take over ownership of roads in the subdivision until drainage problems are completely under control.
