

WHAT COUNCIL DID

James Bilborrow Joins Georgetown Police Force

James Bilborrow, who has just moved to Georgetown from Port Credit, has been hired as a probationary constable on Georgetown's new police force.

He was one of five applicants interviewed Monday at the council meeting. Mr. Bilborrow will replace Constable Alex McLeod who resigned last month to accept a position with the Kitchener police force. He will receive a salary of \$2,700 yearly.

Mrs. Bilborrow will begin a new teaching position at Wrigglesworth School in September, where she will replace Mrs. Harold Henry as a kindergarten teacher.

Parking on the south side of Church street from Main to Market will be prohibited in future, with an amendment to the traffic by-law passed to this effect.
