Mrs. Deans succumbed to a severe stroke at her home, 40 Charles St. She had been a Georgetown resident for 29 years. Her husband is Halton County clerk, and also holds executive positions on several county boards.

Mrs. Deans, formerly Margaret Shewan, was born in Peterhead, Scotland, the daughter of the late Alexander and Catharine Sim Shewan. Mr. and Mrs. Deans lived in Aberdeen for a short time after their marriage, then came to Canada 44 years ago. They lived in Hamilton before coming to town.

Active in several phases of church work at St. John's, she had been a Sunday School teacher and OGIT leader. She was a life member of the Woman's Missionary Society which she had served as treasurer, and had also been secretary of one of the Women's Association groups.

Surviving are her husband, three daughters, Mrs. R. G. Matland (Constance) and Mrs. W. E. Beam (Mae) of Toronto and Frances of town; three grandchildren, Janet Matland, Nancy and Donald Beam; a brother George Shewan of Wishaw, Scotland, and two sisters, Mrs. Peter Milligan, Peterhead, Scotland and Mrs. James Birnie, Vancouver, B.C. A sister, Mrs. William Anderson of Aberdeen died several years ago.
