### Rev. W. Edgar Gill New Norval Minister

Rev. W. Edgar Gill, B.A., has taken up residence in the manse at Norval to commence his pastorate in United Churches at Norval, Glen Williams and Home Church.

Mr. Gill succeeds the late Rev. A. B. Muir who died in July.

Mr. Gill, a native of Ingersoll, comes here from the Stratfordville, Vienna and Port Burwell charge of the church. For the past year he has been serving on the staff of Fairhaven Rehabilitation Home in Ingersoll.

A 1933 graduate of the University of Western Ontario, London, he received his theological degree from Emmanuel College in 1938. He first preached at churches in Ravenswood, Welburn and Linwood. He served as chaplain during the war, first in training camps at Chatham and Prince Rupert, then overseas where he was with No. 1 Canadian General Reinforcement Unit at Aldershot, then with 2nd Armoured Bde. H.Q. and with the Queen's Own Rifles in occupied Germany.

Mr. Gill spent a year at London Rehabilitation Centre when he returned, then preached at St. Joseph's Island near the Soo.

His wife, the former Mary Harcourt is a missionary's daughter. Her father, the late Rev. Dr. James R. Harcourt was at the central India mission of the United Church and her mother still lives in India. Mrs. Gill lived for some time in Guelph with her uncle, the late Dr. Robert Harcourt, who was head of the Dept. of Chemistry at the OAC until 1945. She has two sisters in India, Miss Helen Harcourt, matron at Landour Hospital in Mussoorie and Dr. Margaret Ginn, a house physician at Clara Swain Hospital, Bareilly, where her husband is business manager.

Mr. and Mrs. Gill have two children, Ted, 12 who will be a Grade 8 student at Norval and Jim, 14, who has enrolled in Grade 10 at Georgetown High School. This past summer Mr. Gill has been attending a clinical training course for ministers at Hamilton Sanitarium, operated by McMaster University. He intends to continue postgraduate studies in pastoral psychology at Emmanuel this winter.

### ELK LAKE MINISTER VISITOR LAST WEEK

Rev. C. D. Lemke, United Church minister at Elk Lake in northern Ontario, renewed acquaintances in this district one day last week. He had been visiting in Galt and was on his way to Whitby to attend a conference on evangelism and social service at Whitby Ladies' College.

Mr. Lemke was minister of the Norval, Home and Glen Williams churches until a year ago. June, when he went to Elk Lake. He was succeeded here by the late Rev. A. B. Muir who died in July.

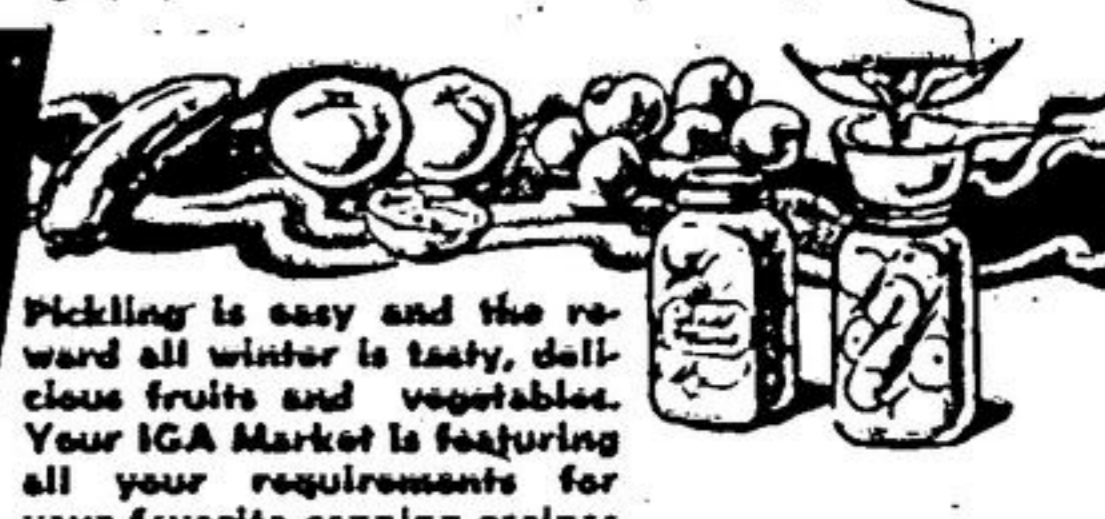

### FACILITIES IMPROVED AT THE POST OFFICE

Alterations were started at the post office on Monday by the Hawes and Nelson contracting firm which will add a considerable number of rental boxes for convenience of the public. Tiers of new boxes are being installed along the wall to the left of the main entrance, and the doorway which leads from the lobby to that part of the building will be blocked off. The boxes are far enough from the wall to allow access to the boxes from the rear for sorting. Designed as a temporary measure until the town grows to sufficient size for postal delivery, the alterations will add some 245 new rental boxes for which there is a heavy demand. Certain other improvements will also be made, with two new windows added and the present drop letter box moved from its location beside the large window.
