## Speed Crackdown Starts Cars Electrically Timed

A police-council crackdown on speeding motorists had its first chapter Saturday when the new Ametron Speedometer-Meter was used for the first time on Main St. N.

As a result, a number of summons will be issued later this week for motorists to appear in magistrate's court to answer the speeding charges.

Last Wednesday, signs were erected at all the main entrances to town warning that speed is electrically timed. The portable Ametron machine will be used at various locations in town, and its amazing accuracy will make it difficult for those who break safety laws to avoid a fine as penalty.

Police Chief Roy Haley, working in close cooperation with council's police committee headed by Cr. Walter Gray, says it is not Georgetown's intention to persecute motorists as in the case in some municipalities. The Ametron will not be used to exact penalties from those who may be slightly over the minimum speed at certain places where it is reasonably safe to do so. But the campaign will give police a chance to enforce laws which up to the present have been allowed to be broken because the provincial police were not sold on a "speed trap" system and had a much more cumbersome way of proving excessive speed.

The Ametron system works with a couple of tapes across a roadway leading to an electrical machine in the police car which is uncannily accurate in registering the exact speed of a vehicle.

Can the tapes be seen? Of course, if you're driving at a reasonable speed, and looking for them. But chances are that those who will be getting their invitations in the mail within the next week were blissfully unaware of the tapes.

Sometime Saturday afternoon, the portable radio was removed from the Wigo store, which is operated by Maurice Goudekting and his brother-in-law Ed Weiner, just a few steps from the police office.

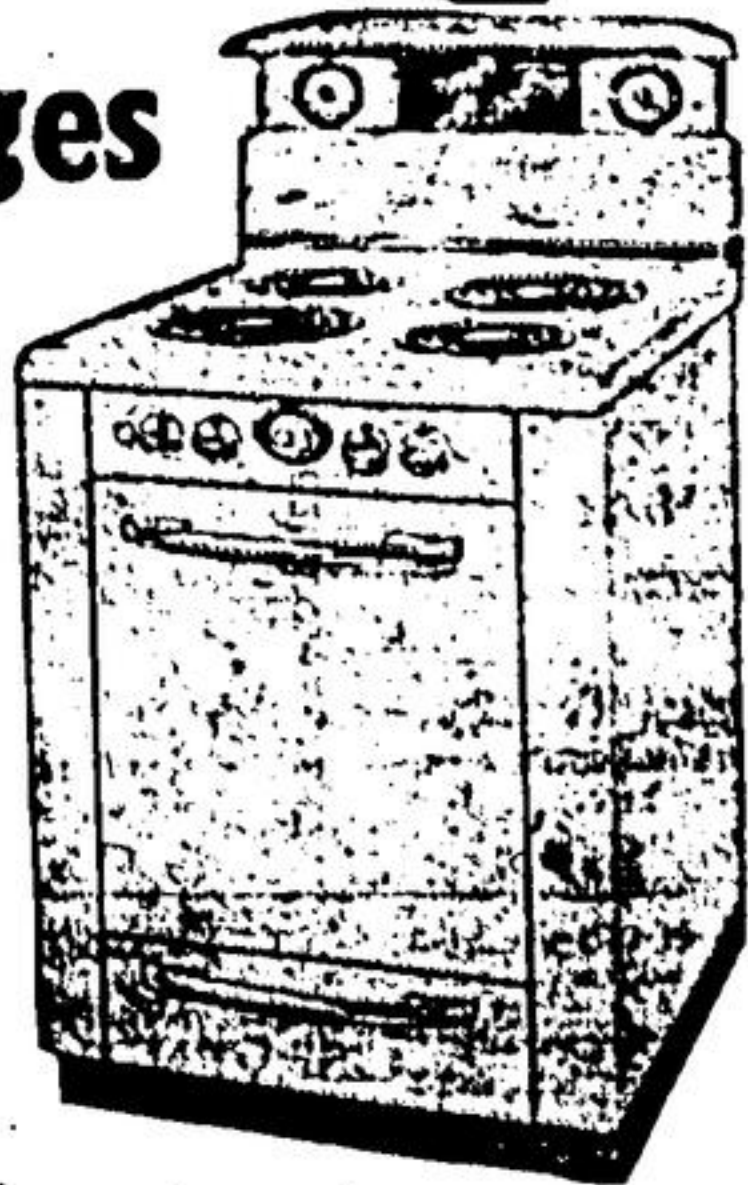

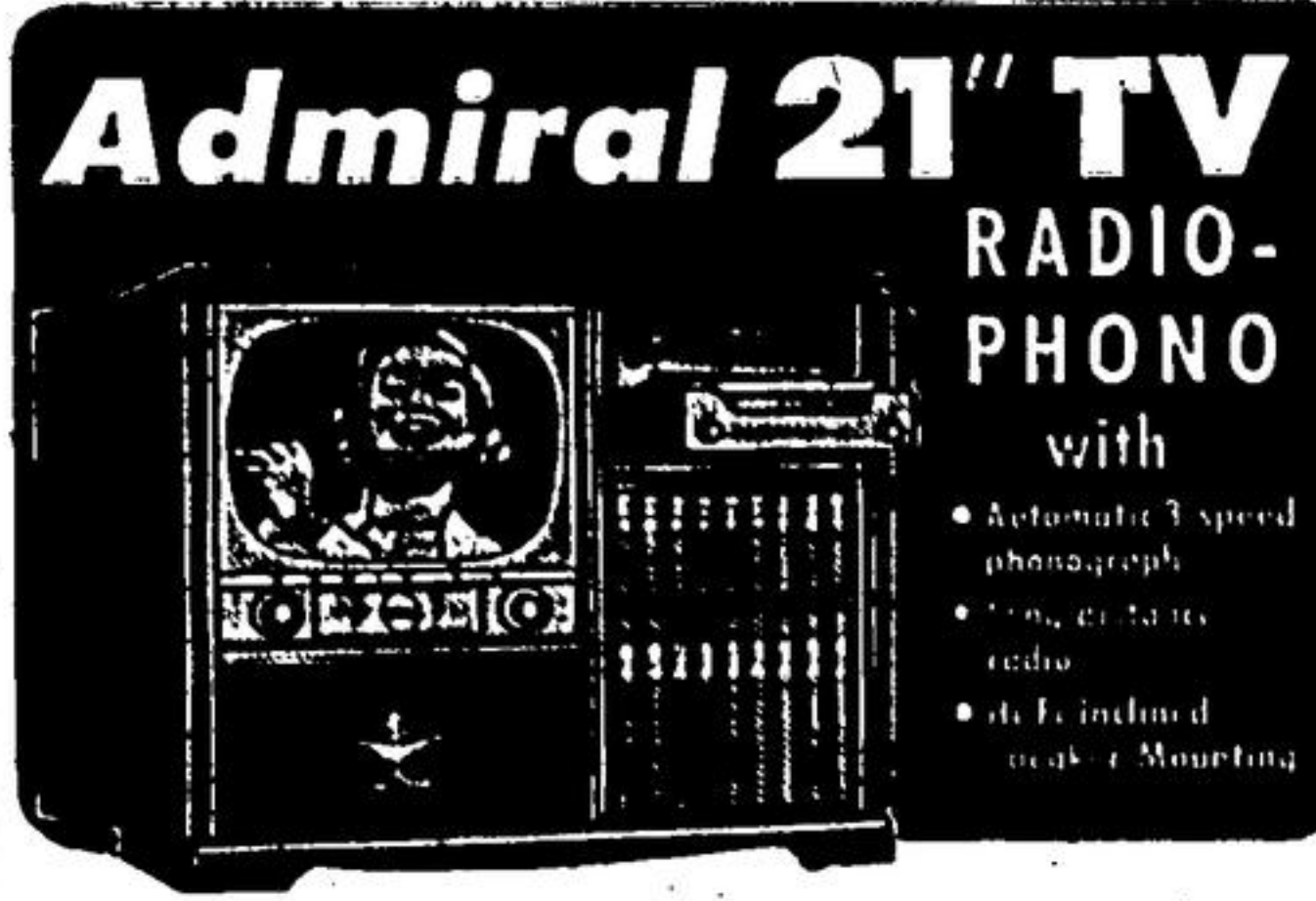
