**Milton Hospital Will  
Be Ready 1956 Fall**

"The stork will walk," announces John S. Wright, noting just one of the benefits of the projected Milton general hospital, of which committee he is president. The first sod of the undertaking will be turned in the spring of next year, to serve the three thousand families of the 150-square miles around Milton. At present there is only a 15 bed private hospital.

"The Milton 'Stork,'" says Mr. Wright, "now has to fly at least sixteen miles to Brampton or Oakville, sometimes farther, but he will soon be able to walk, if he wants, once our hospital gets going. Emergency cases of all kind, however serious, are the things we can't deal with as we now are, with fifteen beds for ten thousand people. That's why this hospital project is being pushed by all of us, men and women, citizens and firms alike."

"Planting this 50 bed hospital in the centre of an agricultural district brings everyone in the Milton area into the picture," says Mr. Wright. "Even with the 15 or more industries already in the district it is absolutely essential to have the support of the farmers, and their wives, and we already know they are keen on the idea."

The fully equipped Milton Hospital will cost approximately \$600,000. The cost will be met by the people of the district, backed by grants from the Federal and Provincial governments and by whatever grants may be forthcoming from the Town of Milton and the four townships of the district.

Once built, the hospital plans to be self-supporting, and independent of further grants until such time as any expansion is called for.

It already has the blessing of the Provincial Dept. of Health, and will be in operation by the fall of 1956.

He is survived by his wife, daughter, a brother, Bill in Kingston and a sister in Australia.

The funeral service was in McClure's Funeral Home, Brampton, on Wednesday, September 23rd. Interment in Dixon Cemetery.

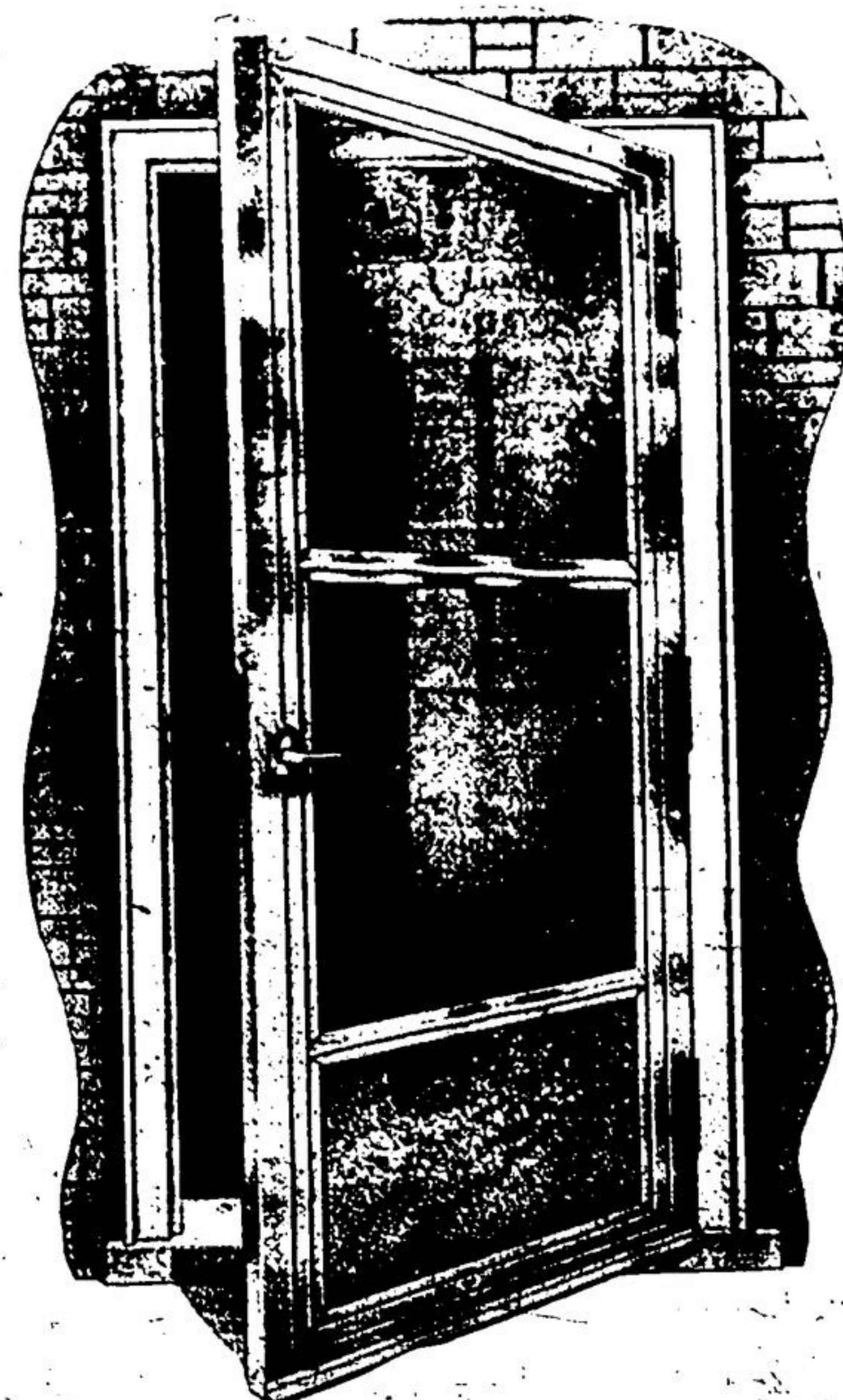
