**Plans Proceed for
Night School Classes**

The Night School committee are very pleased at the number of applications already received for the 1953-54 Night School classes.

For those who may yet be hesitating whether or not to join a class, some of the courses are listed below with an explanation about what may be done at the class.

Beginners' Ceramics — Includes the preparation of clay; methods of shaping objects (coil method, sculpting, hand-molding and casting, throwing on the wheel); finishing, glazing, firing, etc. Students will create pieces of pottery.

Beginners' Oil Painting — For those who have not had instruction before in oil painting.

Intermediate Oil Painting — For those who have had some instruction in oil painting and fundamentals of art.

Advanced Oil Painting — Coaching mainly in the finishing stages of oil painting.

Millinery — The use of materials and methods of trimming, lining, etc. Students will make hats.

Public Speaking — Fundamental of public speaking, conducting meetings, making speeches.

Aluminum Etching — Etching designs on aluminum trays, plaques, etc. also on copper.

Silk Screen Printing — Printing designs in one or more colours on wood, metal, fabrics, various papers, or any flat surface. Making Xmas cards, posters, display cards, signs of any size.

Beginners' Sewing — Care of fabrics, explanation of sewing terms, types of seams, etc., measurements and material requirements, pattern layout, simple pattern cutting, assembling garments, pressing, etc. Students will make at least one garment from an Easy to Sew pattern, more than one article if capable. Individual problems which may be interesting to whole class will be discussed before the class.

Upholstering — Replacing springs, webbing, stuffing, recovering small pieces of upholstered furniture.

Interior Decorating — Choosing material of drapes, upholstery, etc. colour schemes, furniture arrangement, period furniture.

Puppetry — Making of puppets from wood and plaster, dressing dolls and manipulation of strings.

Furniture Refinishing — Removing old finish, preparation of wood for staining, staining and filling, applying new finish to small pieces of furniture. One or two pieces will be finished by each individual in the class.

Electronics — Fundamentals for beginners.

Drama — Directing a play, stage management, lighting, props, make-up, casting.

First Aid — Conducted by St. John's Ambulance. The course is a requisite for anyone working in Civil Defense posts.

Rugmaking — Designing, what materials to use for braiding, hooking small rugs.

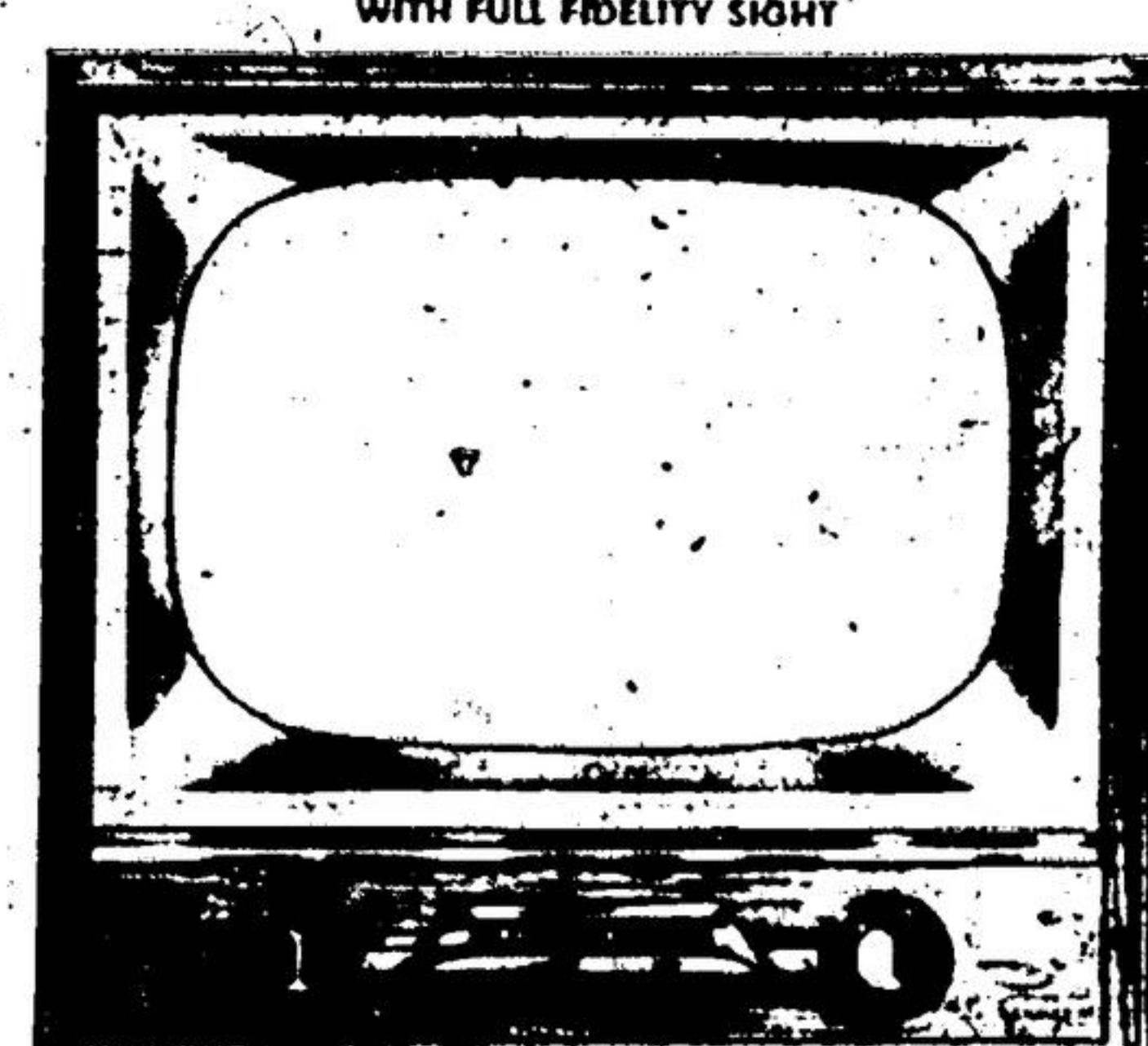
