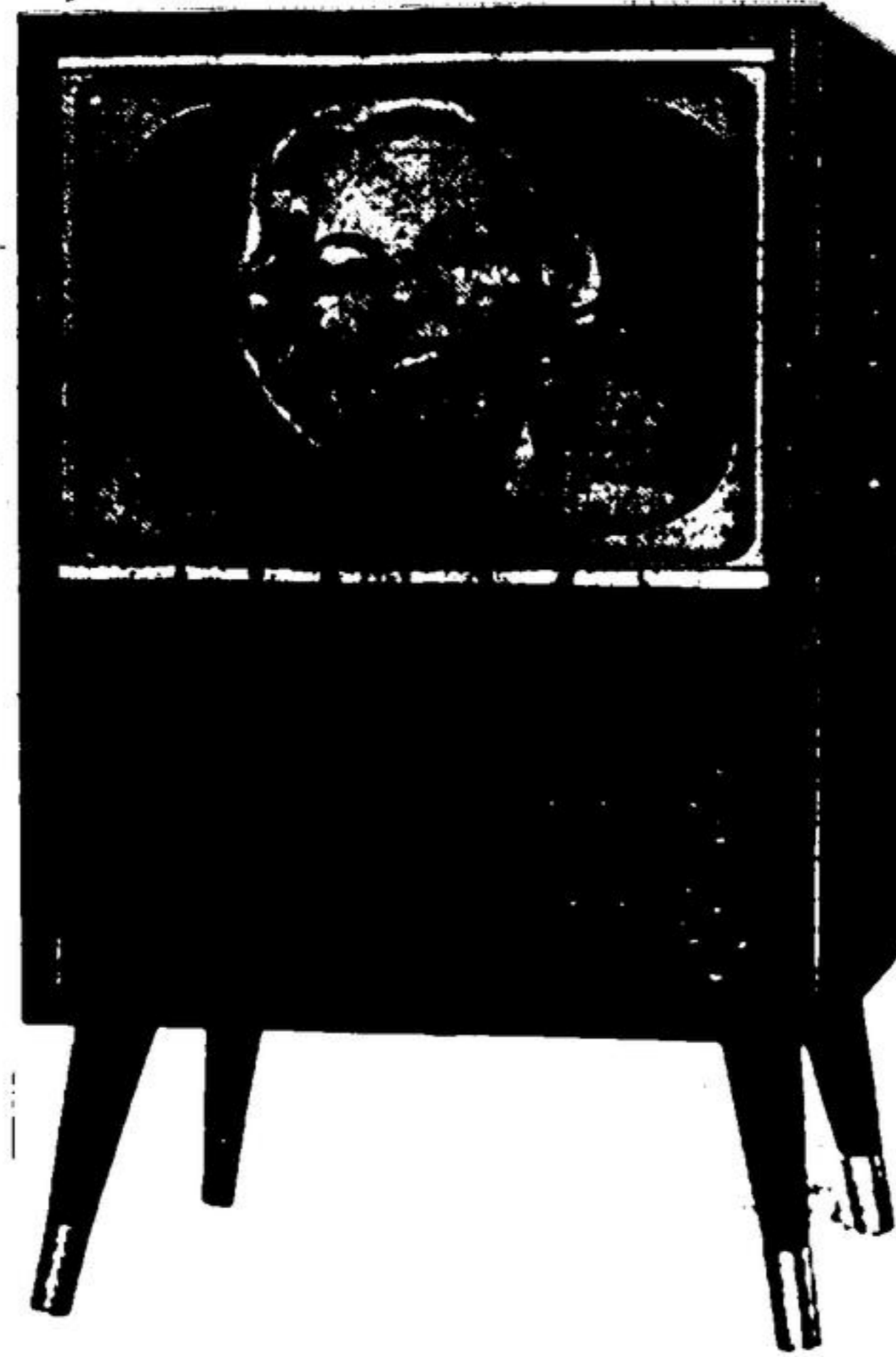

Murton George Tustin Was Business Machine Inventor

A Limehouse district resident since 1920, Murton George Tustin, 80, died at his home, R. R. 4, Acton, September 27th.

Mr. Tustin who had lived retired for the past fifteen years, was an inventor and at one time had his own company, Canadian Multiples Co. which handled a variety of business machines. While living in Virginia before the first war, he developed one of the first models of the desk type adding machines, but his patents lapsed before he could realize the full benefits of his labour.

Born in Leighton Buzzard, a London, England, suburb, he emigrated to the States in 1903 and lived for ten years in Charlottesville, Virginia, before moving to Toronto. In 1920 he purchased his property in Esqueaux which he first used for a summer home, then later as a permanent location. During the first war he served as a rifle instructor with the reserve army.

His wife, Ada Harriet Lucas died twenty years ago. He is survived by three children, Jack, Edna (Mrs. M. Magder) and Dorothy of Toronto; three grandchildren; and one brother, Lynn Tustin, who lives in Sheffield, England.

Rev. J. E. Maxwell conducted the funeral service on Friday at the Harold C. McClure funeral home, with interment following in Greenwood Cemetery, Georgetown. Pallbearers were four neighbours, Fred Brooks, Fred Brown, Harvey McDowell, and Robert McVey, his grandson Paul Magder and George Tobin, Toronto.
