Top Price of \$610 at Reidsan Farm Dispersal

The dispersal of the Holstein herd of Reidsan Farms, owned by W. T. Craig Reid of Norval, brought the top price of \$610 for the three year old cow Reidsan Simonne U.S. The purchaser was T. Puccini, of King City, who bought nine animals, including the herd sire Bryview Palat Monty, at \$310.00. He paid \$380 for Bag Apple Lochinvar Marge, and bought four other milking females at \$350, \$310, \$300 and \$250. He bought two bred heifers, Korndyke Aristocrat A at \$370 and Pansy Ideal Captivator at \$290.

George L. Smith of Rockwood, paid \$330 for the bred heifer Reidsan US Simonne, and \$300 for Reidsan Eagle, a milking female.

Fradol Farms, Brampton, paid \$400 for Reidsan Sady Alcartra B, while her baby heifer went to Edwin Eby, Kitchener for \$80.

Jarvis E. Smith, of Owen Sound, bought two animals, a milking female at \$290 and a bred heifer at \$250. Allan W. Hay, Sunderland, bought a milking female at \$265 and a bred heifer at \$250. Johnston Neeland, Hornby, bought two milking females at \$220 and \$200. Norman H. Smith, of Rockwood paid \$60 each for two baby calves. He also bought an open yearling for \$135 and two heifer calves at \$120 and \$100.

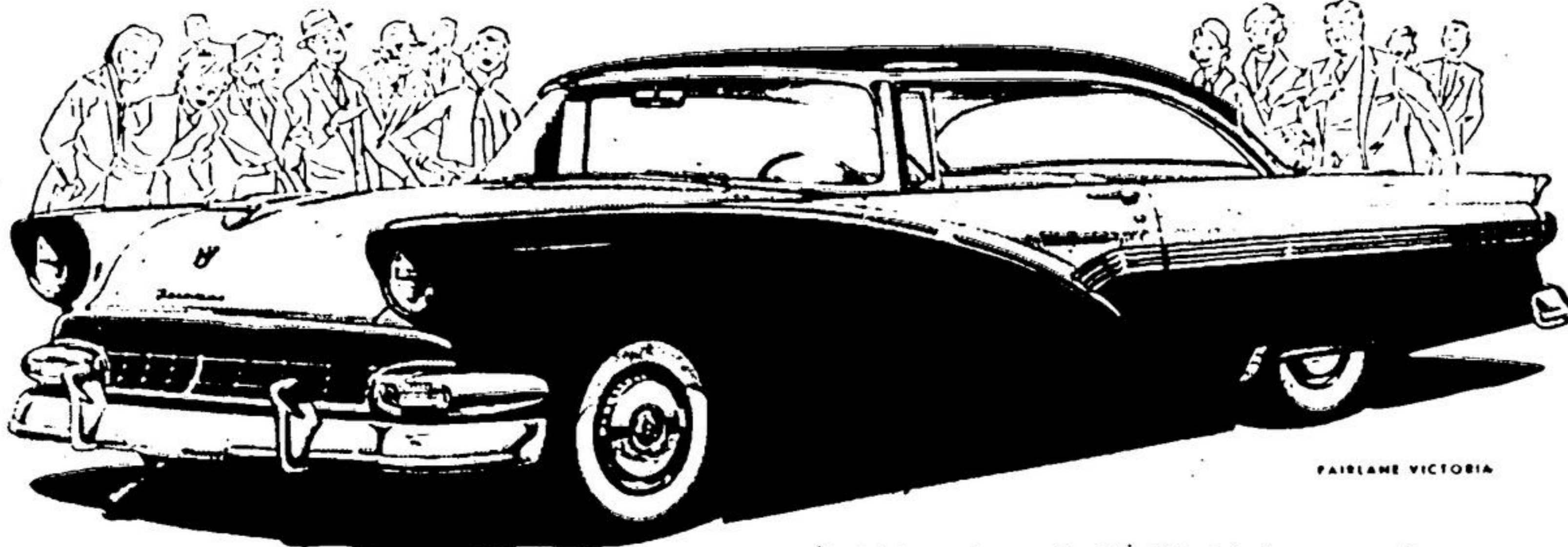

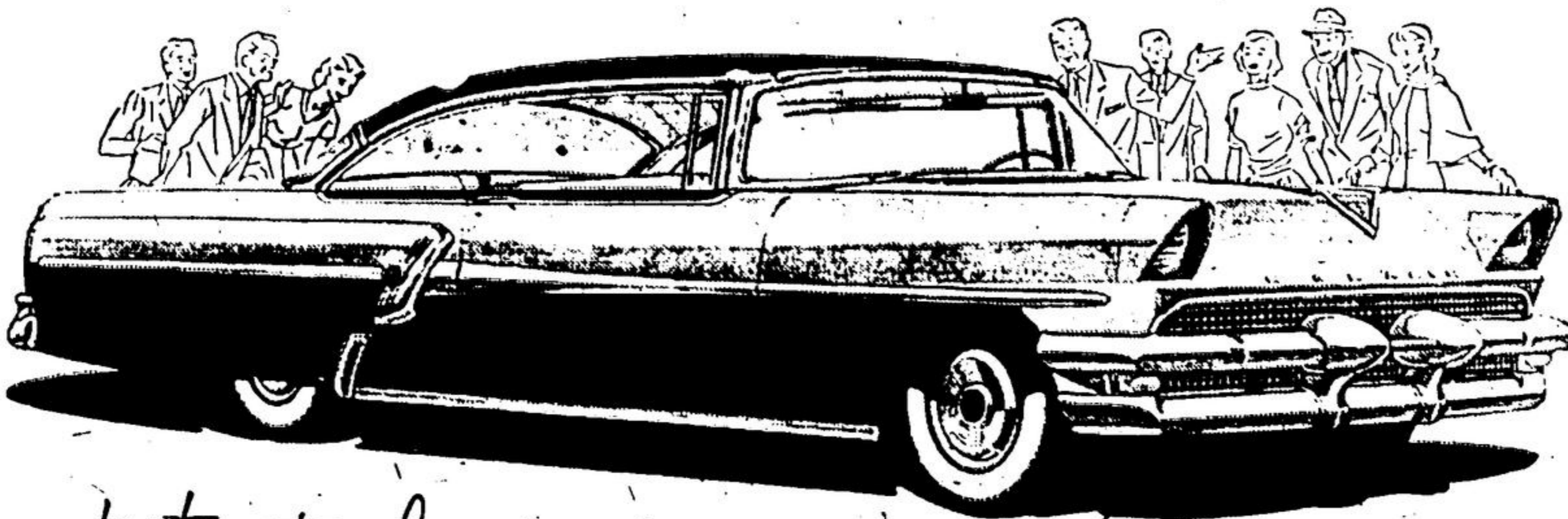
