Holsteins from Halton Breeders Among Shipment of 300 to Peru

A shipment of eleven top Holsteins left Halton airport October 10th for Madrid, Spain. Included were seven bulls and four females, all of them blue bloods representing the finest families of the Holstein breed yet developed in Canada.

The cattle were bought by the Spanish Dept. of Agriculture at Madrid. The bulls are a follow up to a group sent last year for use in the government's artificial breeding program for the improvement of Spanish dairy cows. The heifers are the first Holstein females ever exported from Canada to Spain.

Contributing to the shipment were C. J. Cerawell, Beeton; A. Seiling, Elmira; Ashville Farms, Milton; Bruce Thornton, Thamesford; Robert M. Perrin, Ayr; Harvey Ackert and Son, Kinrossville; C. O. DeLottinville, Brantford; Chas. A. Tomlinson, Hollywood and Hays Farms, Oakville.

The bull contributed by C. J. Cerawell, is a son of the Excellent sire Elmercroft Scepter who is now the Senior Herd Sire at Elmercroft Farms, of Oshawa, one of Canada's top Holstein breeding establishments, and the dam is Bond Haven Rag Apple Juliet who is a former Canadian champion producer and has four records above 22,000 lbs. of milk and 900 lbs. of fat, her largest individual record being 26,575 lbs. of milk and 932 lbs. of fat.

The bull from Harvey Ackert and Son, is sired by Glenafon Copyright, he, a son of the seven times All-Canadian Montvic Rag Apple Marksman. The dam of the Ackert bull is Priscilla Beauty Canary one of the foundation cows in the herd of L. B. Reid, Ripley, Ont. She has a thirteen lactation twice a day milking lifetime production of 175,705 lbs. milk and 6,050 lbs. fat, average test 3.44 per cent butterfat.

From Albert Seiling, Elmira, comes a bull who has three close up crosses to the famous Seiling Royal Wing who is classified as Excellent highest rating for type and has three records above 1200 lbs. of fat, she being the only Holstein in the world to do this. Royal Wing has an eight lactation lifetime total of 172,553 lbs. milk, 7017 lbs. fat, average test 4.07 per cent butterfat.

The bull from Ashville Farms, Milton, is a son of the noted three times All-Canadian Spring Farm Fond Hope out of a cow that was a second prize winner at the Royal and nominated for All-Canadian.

From Robert M. Perrin, comes a son of Glenafon Trademark, he a son of Marksman. The Dam of the Perrin bull classified Very Good and in her first four lactations as a two year old, three year old, four year old and five year old has completed records that are 35 per cent above the Breed Average for milk and 28 per cent above the Breed Average for fat. Her largest individual record made as a five year old on twice a day milking is 18795 lbs. milk 662 lbs. fat, average test 3.52 butterfat.

One of the highest ranking bulls is that secured from C. O. DeLottinville, Brantford. This bull was bred by Wm. Rousquet, La Presentation Quebec, and his dam is classified very good and has in her first five lactations on test completed records that are 71 per cent above the average for the Breed for milk and 57 per cent above the average for the Breed for fat. Her highest individual record which was the largest made in Canada in 1950 in its class is 21,099 lbs. milk, 742 lbs. fat, average test 3.52 per cent as a Junior, three year old on twice a day milking.

From Hays Ltd., comes a son of Marksman out of the Glenafon foundation cow, Fancy Bonheur Kerk, with a mature record of 23,883 lbs. milk, 914 lbs. fat, average test 3.83 per cent butterfat.

The females include three richly bred heifers, which are now in calf, secured from Bruce Thornton, of Thamesford, at the Dispersal of his Pomona Herd recently, and a daughter of Spring Farm Fond Hope bought from Chas. A. Tomlinson, Hollywood,

Ontario. These animals are a high class lot, none of them being from dams graded less than Very Good and all of them having high production in their families. It is hoped that they will further enhance the reputation of Canadian Holsteins in Spain.
