Outstanding Livestock Show Brings Crowds To Erin Fall Fair

Thanksgiving Day this year was one of those beautiful fall days, so in the afternoon we journeyed up to the Erin Fall Fair. Apparently thousands of people had the same idea. The grounds reminded me of the days when I used to walk down the midway of the CNE. Incidentally, I am not referring to the topography of the two areas when I make this comparison. The Erin fair grounds is rolling and what a picturesque spot it is! Aside from the crowd I was impressed by the tremendous livestock show. It apparently is the culmination of all the fall fairs of the area. I did learn they have at Erin the championship shows for Shorthorns, Angus, Herefords, Yorkshires (perhaps some others too) and they not only had numbers of livestock, but top quality too.

Great Beef Show

In the brief time at our disposal we were unable to remain very long at one ring, but in the few minutes spent around the beef cattle rings, it did seem to us that the Shorthorn people in particular had a show comparable with the CNE at least.

Halton Well Represented

When the herd class lined up in the Shorthorn ring, there must have been at least ten different breeders with entries, and four of the top five were from Halton. Here is how they stood — 1st, Scotdale (S. G. Bennett, of Georgetown) 2nd George Lasby, of Guelph 3rd T. C. Amos, Moffat; 4th, Reford Gardhouse, Milton; 5th, W. H. Merry, Milton. We also saw the female championships being awarded and here Scotdale had the senior and grand champion, with Reford Gardhouse having the reserve senior and reserve grand. Both the junior and reserve junior champions also come from the Scotdale herd.

Halton Angus Tops

In the Angus ring, Jim McKay had Dr. W. F. James' string up around the top in all classes. The grand champion male was from this herd, and we also noted, in passing, they had the red ribbons on their Get of Sire group — John C. Willmott, of J. H. Willmott and Son, was also taking his share of seconds in the same ring.

Great Junior Show

The 4-H club members were there from a wide area — Grey, Waterloo, Wellington, Dufferin, South Simcoe, Peel and Halton. In the steer class, it almost seemed like a preview of the Queen's Guinea Class at the Royal Bob Cox of Milton who had the top steer at Milton and Georgetown, had to be content with fourth. And by the way, that's quite an achievement too, when you realize that 38 of the top 4-H steers of the area were in the ring. Don Moffat of Campbellville also had his steer in the first prize group. Douglas Campbell of Moffat and Bob Merry of Milton were in the second prize group, and in the inter-club class for groups of three, the Halton group were second to the group entry from the Orangeville club. Some 12 or 13 different 4-H Clubs were represented in this class.

Halton Top Swine

Unfortunately we did not see the 4-H Swine Club show on Saturday, but Halton's 4-H swine club was represented by Delmar Ford, Geo. Greenlee, and Mervyn Curtis. Delmar had the grand champion gilt of the show, and the Halton club entry of three gilts also took the red ribbon.

Good Judges Too

Halton was also well represented in the judging competition for juniors which was held on Saturday. Some 42 Juniors from the area were in competition and in the junior section for those 16 years and under, George Greenlee for Campbellville was first and in the senior section Tommy Hunter of Georgetown was second.
