## Holy Land Visit Basis For Talk

Speaking at St. George's Anglican Church on Sunday morning, Sam Penrice used a wartime visit to the Holy Land as a basis for a talk in which he used the biblical verse "and they came to the tomb and found the stone rolled away" as his theme.

Mr. Penrice told of how the Royal Air Force arranged a visit for him with his brother, who was in the army, when their father was seriously ill in England and it was impossible to have them sent home. The brothers used their time together to visit historical spots in the east, culminating in a visit to the garden of Joseph of Arimathea where they viewed the tomb. When they thought back to the significance of this, a heavy stone seemed to roll away from their own thoughts, he said.

Other members of the Brotherhood of Anglican Churches assisted the rector, Rev. Kenneth Richardson, in conducting the service as part of a nationwide observance of Laymen's Sunday in the churches. ### Astengo Premier Exhibitor At Chicago International

Rockwood Rocket Tone was named Senior and Grand Champion after heading the class for Holstein bulls three years old and over at the International Dairy Show at Chicago. He is owned by the Quinte and District Cattle Breeding Association, Belleville and was bred by Rockwood Holsteins, St. Norbert, Manitoba, Ontario stood first in the state herd class and Dr. Hector I. Astengo, of Brampton, was premier breeder and premier exhibitor.

Mooseheart Farms were runners-up to Dr. Hector I. Astengo for both the premier breeder and premier exhibitor honours with Pabst Farms Oconomoc, Wis., a close third for premium breeder. Dr. Astengo's won similar honours at the International Dairy Show a year ago.

The state herd class won by Ontario was an exceptionally strong one with Wisconsin, Maryland, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Colorado and Ohio following Ontario in that order. The Ontario entry was headed by the Grand Champion, Rockwood Rocket Tone and included the Reserve Junior Champion female owned by J. J. E. McCague, Alliston, the second prize two-year-old heifer, fifth prize four-year-old and last year's Grand Champion female, all owned by Dr. Astengo, the first prize heifer calf shown by J. M. Fraser, Streetsville, and the third prize Senior Yearling Heifer, owned by David R. Stevens, St. Mary's.

J. J. E. McCague's Reserve Junior champion female was Glenvue Nettie Tensen, who headed a class of twenty-four Junior Yearling heifers. In this class Canadian entries stood first, second and third, with J. M. Fraser in second place and the entry of Hallward and Houck, Brampton, third. J. M. Fraser's entry in a class of thirty-six heifer calves, Spring Farm Fond Sally was a strong winner. A smooth, slight topped individual she was strong of loin and blended well throughout.

She is a daughter of the noted Spring Farm Fond Hope. J. M. Fraser stood second on a group by Spring Farm Fond Hope in the Junior Get-of-Sire class. This group included Spring Farm Fond Prince who was second in the Senior Yearling bull class in which class the CNE Junior
