**WHAT COUNCIL DID**

**Students at Council  
See Civic Government**

An object lesson in civics was provided for Grade 8 students from Wrigglesworth public school Monday, when they attended a session of town council.  
Principal William Kinrade brought half of his class to the meeting and plans to attend a future meeting with the balance of the students.  
The fourteen young people present were welcomed by Mayor Jack Armstrong, who outlined council procedure and the functions of the various departments of municipal government.

A \$200 expenditure for reproducing maps necessary for the brief on town zoning which is being prepared by Dr. E. G. Faludi's firm of Town Planning Consultants, was passed by the council.

Council will take action on a suggestion by Cecil Davidson that a hydrant at the Durham Street - Highway corner be moved inside the street line. The hydrant is in a dangerous location. Mr. Davidson also asked action on erecting a stop sign at the Albert - McNabb corner and this will be attended to.

Kenneth Swales, Cleveholme Dr. pointed out a cave-in on the roadway near his home, where the sewer and water lines were installed. The town has already filled in twice, and he asked that the engineer look over the situation again to see what further action may be necessary.

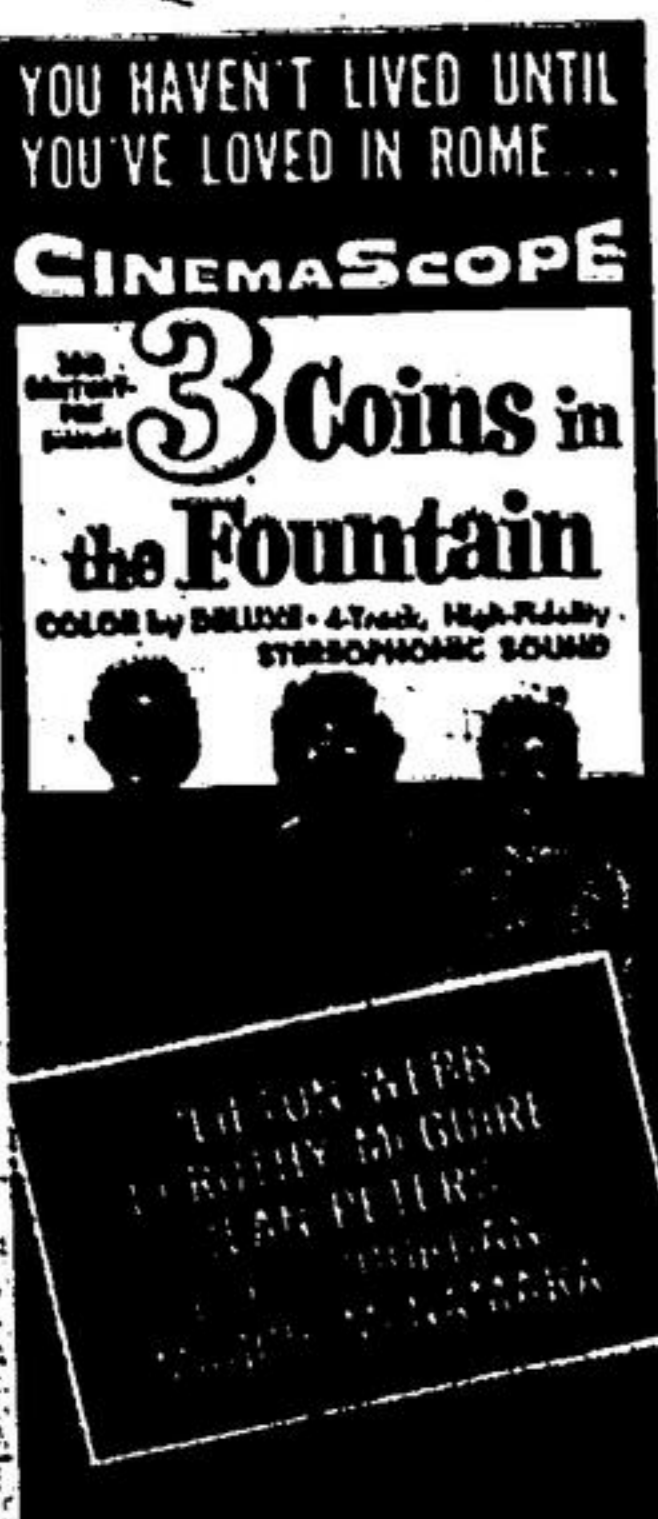

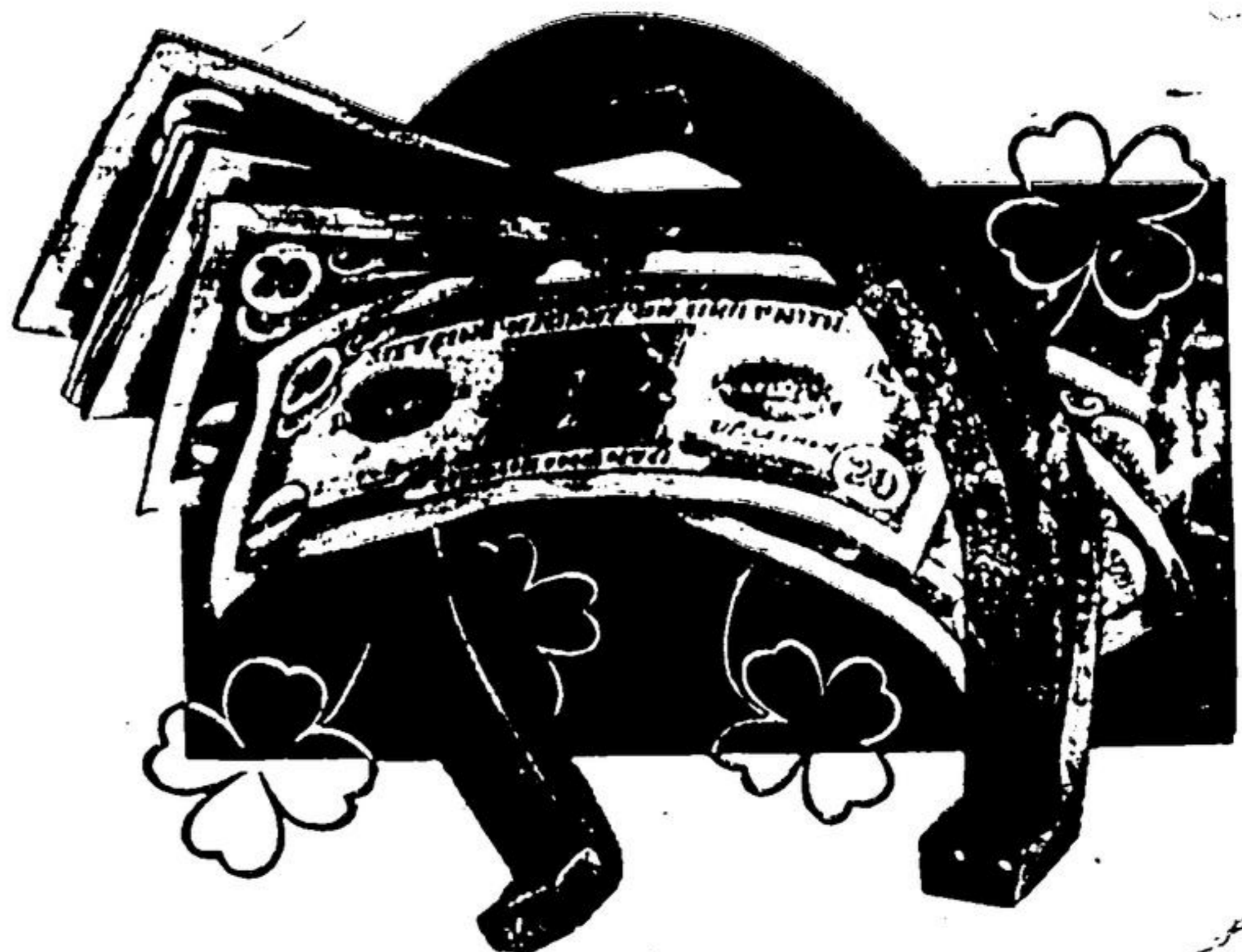
