## Fair Board Hears of Lily Development

Interpreting his talk with some human interest stories about a "flower photographing" trip in the States last summer, Sandy Best, showed colored slides and detailed his research work with lilies to members of Esqueing Agricultural Society at their annual dinner meeting Saturday.

The event was held in the community hall at Stewarttown, with ladies of Hallinford W.I. catering for the turkey dinner.

Mr. Best, who is on the University of Toronto biology staff, lives on the farm near Stewarttown where his garden contains an incredible number of lilies.

His listeners were amazed to learn how much painstaking research goes into development of selective breeding and hybrids for different climates, rare colorings and variety of growing season. Many of the original wild lilies have been imported from China in selective breeding, blooms from the same family which contain a certain characteristic are interbred until a completely new strain appears. In hybridization, new varieties are produced by crossing different families.

He drew many parallels between plant and animal breeding, and showed how horticulture research while it might seem unimportant to a country's economy is valuable, both in terms of it being a corollary to the production of food, for its research is interrelated to that of grains and fruits.

He mentioned the possibility of this district being someday a centre of more diversified agriculture, with nurseries and market gardens joining dairy and crop farming. He showed a sample of a wild lily bulb, picked not far from where he was speaking, which was used as a fool by the Indians of bygone days.

Last summer, he toured extensively in eastern Canada and the States, photographing wild lilies in their natural habitat. These colored slides were included with scenes in his own garden, and that of Miss Isabella Preston of town, now retired from her position at the Ottawa Experimental Farm and internationally known for her research work in horticulture.

Jim Fisher thanked Mr. Best for his talk and Mrs. Spencer Wilson expressed thanks to the ladies who catered, with Mrs. Frank Smith replying for that group.
