

Foot Fractured Car Turns Over

bumped into the rear of the car ahead, it then swerved off the highway, turning upside down in the ditch. Miss Beverly Prosser, of Brampton, was the only one injured, suffering a fractured foot. Damage to the Patterson car, amounted to approximately \$800 and \$75 damage was suffered by Mr. Schroer. The highway at that hour was quite slippery. 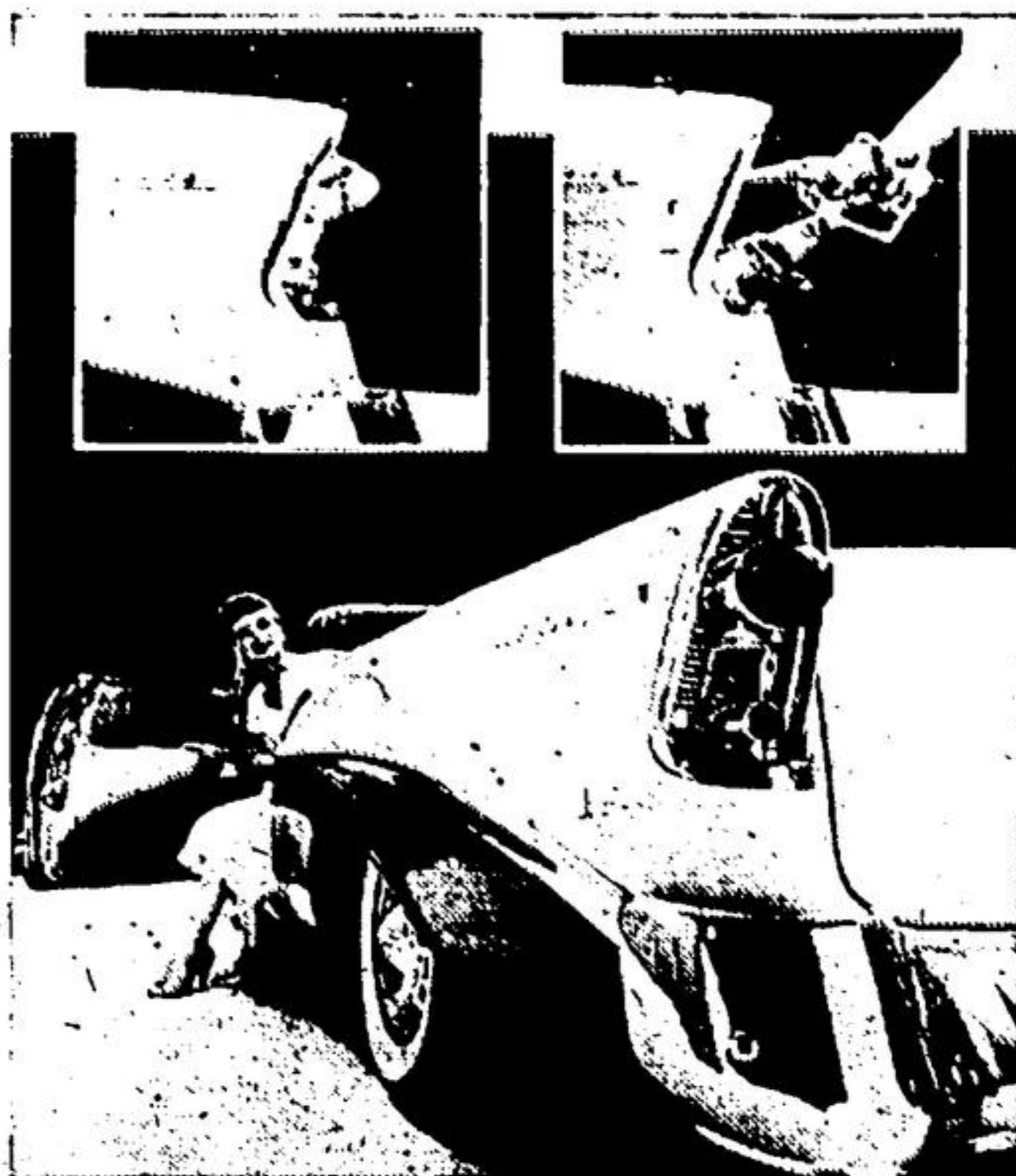
