**PUC Commissioner
Returned at Oakville**

In one of the smallest turnouts of voters in recent years, incumbent Cameron C. Hillmer was swept back into office as public utilities commissioner for the town of Oakville by a margin of 438, to 146 over his opponent councillor Ernest Savan.

This was the only contest in the Oakville election race. The entire council and school board were given acclamations.

Oakville electors turned down a council-sponsored plebiscite on the use of the parking lot portion of Wallace Park as a playground for a proposed Sheddon Avenue public school. Voters were asked if they favoured part time use of the parklands for a public school playground. The question was turned down 657 to 228.
