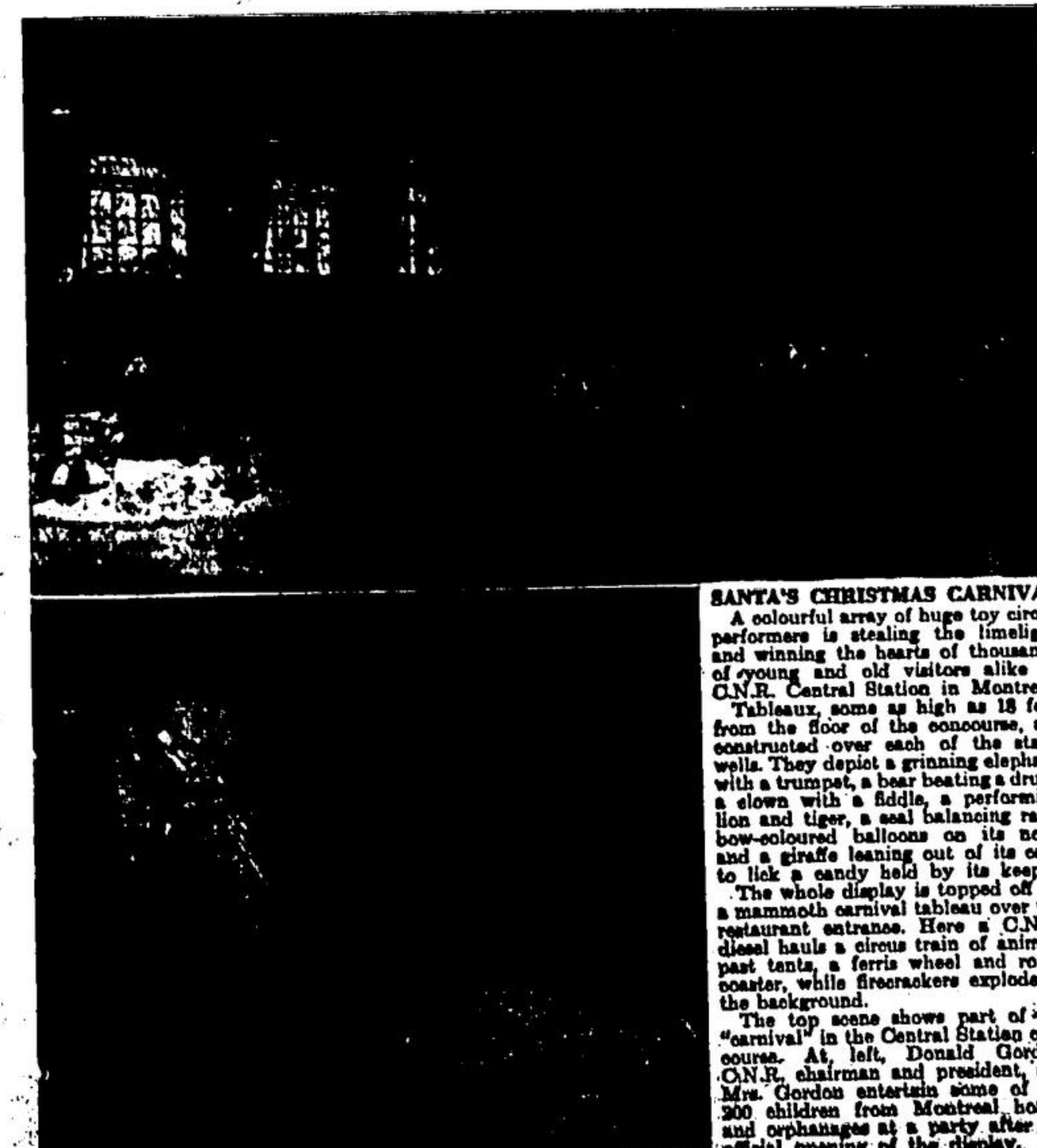

SANTA'S CHRISTMAS CARNIVAL

A colourful array of huge toy circus performers is stealing the limelight and winning the hearts of thousands of young and old visitors alike at C.N.R. Central Station in Montreal. Tableaux, some as high as 18 feet from the floor of the concourse, are constructed over each of the stairwells. They depict a grinning elephant with a trumpet, a bear beating a drum, a clown with a fiddle, a performing lion and tiger, a seal balancing rainbow-coloured balloons on its nose, and a giraffe leaning out of its cage to lick a candy held by its keeper. The whole display is topped off by a mammoth carnival tableau over the restaurant entrance. Here a C.N.R. diesel hauls a circus train of animals past tents, a ferris wheel and roller coaster, while firecrackers explode in the background. The top scene shows part of the "carnival" in the Central Station concourse. At left, Donald Gordon, C.N.R. chairman and president, and Mrs. Gordon entertain some of the 300 children from Montreal homes and orphanages at a party after the official opening of the display.
