JEHOVAH WITNESSES TO CONVENE IN GUELPH

During the week-end of January 20-22 the Georgetown congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses will convene for their semi-annual circuit assembly with nine congregations, embracing points from Islington to Brampton in the south, to Orangeville and Guelph. This assembly is to be held at the Guelph Collegiate in Guelph. Sessions are to commence Friday evening, continuing through Saturday and climaxing Sunday afternoon with the public Bible discourse, "Overcoming the Fears of this Generation." The speaker, Mr. J. H. Nathan, just recently returned from the European series for world-wide "Triumph Kingdom Assemblies" and has had many years of assisting congregations in eastern and western Canada.

Another highlight of this assembly will be the baptismal service held on Saturday afternoon, at which time individuals will symbolize their dedication to Jehovah God.

The purpose of these assemblies is to promote more efficient ministering by Jehovah's Witnesses. This is done by discourse and demonstration.

As in other centres, this assembly will feature a cafeteria which, it is expected, will serve 1,500 meals. 500 delegates will participate in this assembly and a peak attendance of 800 is expected at the public meeting.
