**Norval, Union Presbyterians Active Supporters of Missions**

Presbyterian churches at Norval and Union were particularly active supporters of church mission work last year.

Reviewing the year's work at annual meetings held last week, a total of \$1655 was subscribed to this part of the church's activity.

Both churches oversubscribed their allocations and accepted an increase for 1956 with the hope that these in turn would be oversubscribed. Union has pledged \$623 for mission work and Norval \$913.

Rev. G. Lockhart Royal is minister of the churches and at both meetings he commended the congregation for supporting one of the most important reasons for the church's existence. At Norval, in addition to mission givings, a special \$1,000 gift was made to the extension fund of Toronto Presbytery, which provides funds for building new churches in the presbytery.

At Union on Monday, Arthur McKane acted as chairman and Mrs. Vern Thompson secretary for the meeting which followed a noon dinner served by the ladies.

Three members retired from the board of management, Eric Leslie, Fred Lyons and W. F. Hunter. Succeeding them for 3 year terms are Art McKane, Howard Dolson and Hugh Leslie. Other members of the board include Herbet Dolson, Wilfrid Leslie, Fraser Macdonald, Frank Dolson, Norman News and J. A. Macdonald.

Owens Macdonald joined the session during 1955, whose members also include the minister, Art McKane, Clarence Anderson, Norman Icam, F. H. Lyons, F. L. Thompson, George H. Leslie and Wilfrid Leslie.

Owens Macdonald and Lloyd Crichton were reappointed auditors. Physical progress of the church last year included installation of a new oil heating system and addition of a new sign post, which is being erected now.

Reports of organizations given at the meeting included those of the Sunday School, Sunshine Mission Band, Home Helpers, Women's Association and Women's Missionary Society.

On Tuesday, the Norval congregation held a similar dinner meeting with Rev. G. L. Royal, acting as chairman and Mrs. Hugh Clark as secretary.

An interesting feature last year was production of a cook book by the W.A. which gained international publicity when John Watkins, Canadian ambassador to Russia and a member of the church took one with him to Moscow.

The Sunday School at Norval has shown remarkable growth, almost tripling in numbers in four years. Four new classrooms were added last year, with a consequent increase in the teaching staff to ten. Sid Hardie has moved to Georgetown and his position.
