

## DEPT. NIXES NEW LOCATION HIGH SCHOOL STAYS ON NO. 7

### STEWARTTOWN

The Dept. of Education will not approve a site for a complete new high school in Georgetown. A committee, delegated by North Halton school board to interview the department recently was advised to acquire more land at the present location and suggested the board make a 4-room addition on the school with provision for a second storey which would add eight more classrooms eventually. The board, faced with necessity of finding accommodation for September for an estimated four classrooms of students, has been considering purchase of a site near Georgetown park for building either a small auxiliary high school or a large structure to replace the present one. The present school comprises the original 75 year old edifice plus a substantial addition made three years ago. Eventual plan, at the time the

addition was constructed, was to someday tear down the old building and replace it with a more modern wing. The architect's sketch embodied this as well as addition of a gymnasium whenever this is desired to be added.

At last week's school board meeting in Georgetown, a motion was passed authorizing the Georgetown board members to negotiate with Jack Tost, owner of adjoining property, for purchase of necessary land.

Ross Carbert, Nassagaweya, was named board chairman this year, with Ernest Forgrave, Georgetown, as vice chairman.

Committee appointed with the first named chairman, are: Finance, Hood, Hall, Anderson, Dills, Masterman, Transportation, Anderson, Goodlet, Brown, Building, Cook, Forgrave, Pickett, Coon, Kielty; Property, Masterman, Coles, Hood.

A new member, Andrew Kielty, joined the board. He is an appointee of Milton Separate School Board.

A letter was received from the county clerk requesting North Halton board to nominate a representative to the proposed consultative committee which will make a study of the high school education in Halton. K. C. Lindsay, Esqueusing Township clerk, was named to represent the school board.

A 6 mill budget was set for 1956. This levy is a slight increase over the 5.3 mills required in 1955.

Total estimated expenditures are \$198,100. Government grants are \$103,700 and \$119,250 will be raised by tax levy on the five municipalities which comprise the district.

### Monday Storm Brings Three Minor Accidents

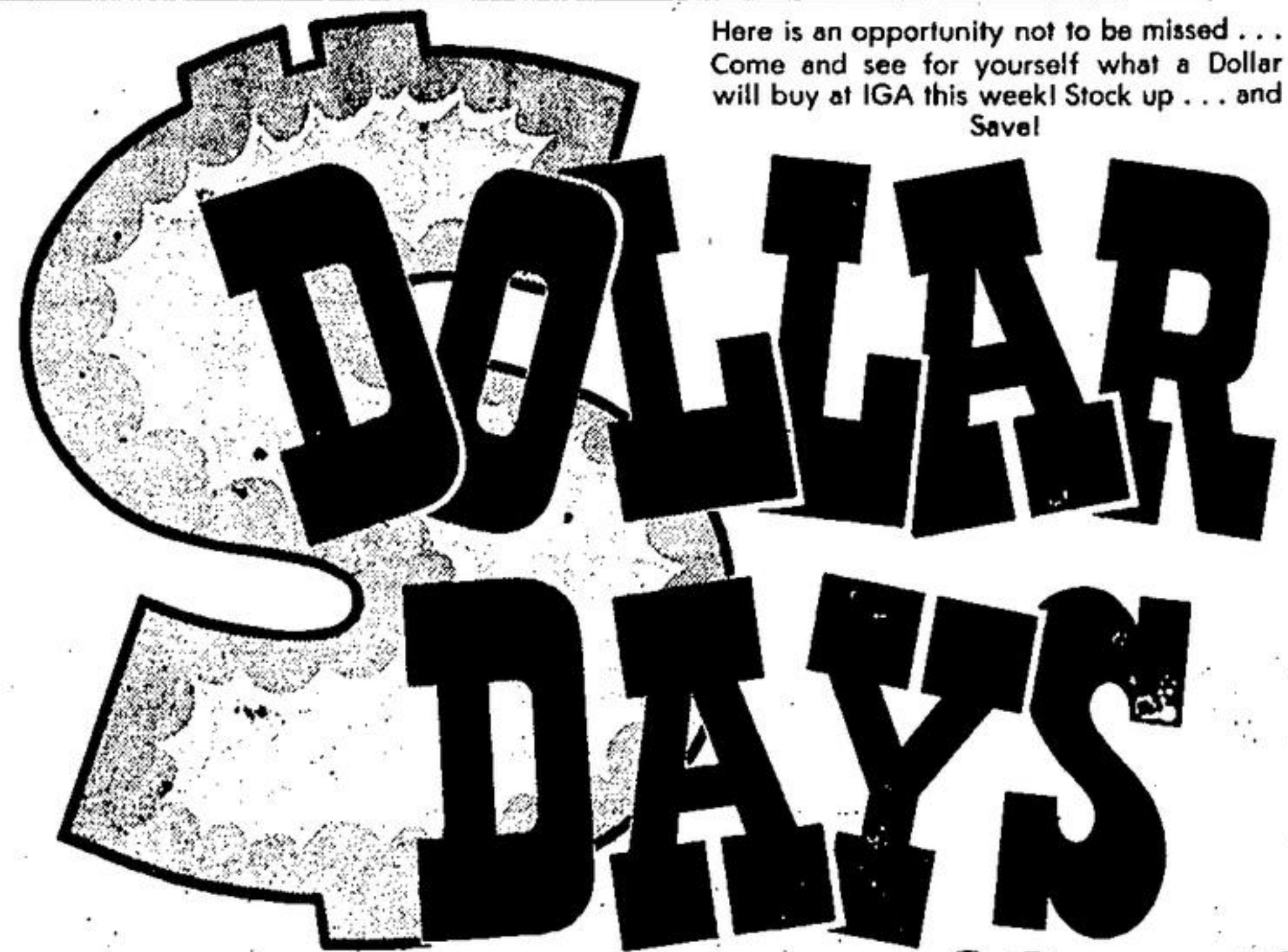
