CHAS. McINNIS TO SPEAK AT SEED FAIR

Last week we announced the Hon. F. S. Thomas, Ontario's minister of agriculture, as the guest speaker for Halton's Seed Fair on Saturday, Mar. 24. A few days ago we learned from reeve A. R. Service of Nassagaweya, who is also secretary of the Halton High Producers' Association and a director of the Halton Soil and Crop Improvement Association, that Chas. McInnis, president of the Ontario Hog Hog Producers Association, had also agreed to speak at the same meeting. This will give Halton Seed Fair two of the top speakers in Ontario's Agricultural circles. The officers and directors of the Halton Soil and Crop Improvement Association now have their work cut out to get out an exhibit in keeping with their programme.

Urban Board Recommends Gas By-Law 3rd Reading

A third company has had its franchise approved by the Ontario Fuel Board for distributing natural gas in three north Halton towns, Georgetown, Milton and Acton.

Thursday in Toronto, Anthony Gas and Explorations received the same approval as had previously been granted Halton Natural Gas and United Suburban.

Georgetown council has given two readings to by-laws for all three companies.

Next step is for the fuel board to issue a certificate of convenience and necessity to any or all of these companies. The board will hold hearings at which they will determine whether the companies have sufficient supplies of gas, the availability of supplies, financial structure and other pertinent points.

When this is done, the councils of the three towns will deal with the matter further, to finally decide what company or companies will be granted a gas distribution franchise.

While each town acts independently, there has been some cooperation through the tri-urban board, where the matter has been discussed on several occasions.

At a meeting Friday, representatives of the three towns decided to recommend to their councils that third readings be given the by-laws at their February meetings, in order that the fuel board could proceed with the final stages.

Sunbeam Ratepayers Hold Social Evening

The social side of a ratepayers organization was stressed when over 50 members of the Sunbeam Heights area association met in Wrigglesworth School.

An entertainment committee was established and Cliff Found was named chairman. A dance in the near future will be the first activity planned by the committee.

There was discussion on a recreation area in Sunbeam Heights district. Some ratepayers think that vacant lots reserved for this purpose are not adequate and the town council may be asked to consider a larger area.

Sidewalks, storm sewers and culverts were also under discussion, and a majority opinion was that residents would like to have estimates of cost before a formal application is made to council for these improvements.

Maurice Manderson, legal adviser to the association, has contacted Ontario Hydro about hydro poles in people's back lawns and gardens, but no answer has yet been received to his letter.

Sid Hardie, president of the organization chaired the meeting and secretary Mrs. Veitch read minutes and correspondence.

It was reported that 85 people had paid their one dollar membership fee.
