Sybil Bennett, M. P. Prayer Day Speaker

Sybil Bennett, QC, MP, was the guest speaker at the Women's World Day of Prayer service held in St. George's Anglican Church last Friday afternoon. Miss Bennett gave a very moving address, stressing the importance of teaching Christianity to the millions of non-Christians in India and Japan and other countries. She warned of the peril of the communist threat which hangs over the countries of the unenlightened people. The communists are constantly trying to impress them and win them over to their way of life and thinking. Spreading the gospel is the best way of all to combat this evil influence. Ending her talk on a personal note, Miss Bennett told the ladies of her presentation to Haile Selassie when he was in Canada for the opening of parliament. Miss Bennett said he was a wonderful man, full of humility and charm. He had been persecuted but did the right thing and won out in the end. He was an example for everyone to look up to.
