Vinyl on felt 9" x 9" tile, cost 18c each, vinyl-asbestos 21c each or deluxe vinyl on rubber cost 35c each. A floor size 10 x 12 would cost \$11.20 for the underlay \$1.05 for the nails and \$5.00 for the paste for the tile. The tile would cost \$38.34, \$43.75 or \$74.55 according to type.
