ROSAFE BULL 2000th FOR AIR EXPORT

The 2,000th dairy animal to leave Canada by air was the \$15,000 Holstein bull Rosafe Reflection Nero, who left Malton airport February 28th for Medellin, Colombia. There he will join the herd of Dr. Braulio Henao and Dr. Wm. Gil, who paid this amount, the largest received at a Canadian auction in 1955, for him at the sale of stars last fall. Nero is from the Rosafe herd of Dr. Hector I. Astengo, Brampton, Ontario, and was recently named All-Canadian bull calf for 1955.

Also included in the shipment was Bond Haven Scepter Crusader, All-Canadian two year old of 1955, and All-Canadian Senior Yearling of 1954 for J. G. Brethet and Son, Tottenham. He goes to the government of the province of Antioquia in Colombia for whom the shipment also included a son of the noted extra sire ABC Reflection Sovereign.

To Dr. Henao went a fresh heifer from the herd of Ward A. Shantz, of Waterloo, Ont., together with her baby calf; a fresh heifer from F. C. Eligh, Finch, Ont.; and a bred heifer from Lester C. Baird, St. Mar's, Ont. Consigned to Dr. Gil was a heifer and a calf from R. A. Guest, Brantford, Ont.
