County Takes Action Avoid Rabies Spread

Believing in the adage "an ounce of prevention" a Rabies Contral Committee has been established in Halton, in an effort to ward off any spread of the dread disease, or to control it, should it spread south from the northern Ontario area.

The committee, headed by H. C. Merry of Oakville Humane Society, and with Dr. D. F. Damude, V.S. of Halton Health Unit as secretary, numbers a group of interested county officials in its membership. These include Warden Stan Allen; Dr. A. F. Bull, Halton MOH; Dudley Hitchcock, game warden, Ross Pearen, mayor of Milton; J. E. Whitelock, Ontario Ag-Rep.; and veterinary surgeons Dr. Ben Young, Nassagaweya, Dr. C. H. Heslop, Milton and Dr. Fred Bridgeman, Nelson.

The committee has requested free vaccination of all dogs in Halton by the Dept. of Agriculture, and have also requested a fox-thinning program be undertaken by the Dept. of Lands and Forests.

A recommendation has been made that all dogs be licenced and wear identification tags and all stray and unwanted dogs be picked up and destroy ed if not called for in 72 hours.

Until free vaccination is available, the committee recommends that all hunting dogs and dogs that may come in contact with wildlife be vaccinated by practicing veterinarians.
