The first in a series of messages about Delrex and what it means to the Georgetown area.

Although Georgetown residents see evidence of Delrex every day signs along No. 7 Highway, huge machines grooming former farmland or Delrex trucks shuttling back and forth - many may wonder what, exactly, is

under way. Delrex is to be one of Canada's best planned new communities. Its value, when completed, will be in the vicin-

ity of \$100 million. Delrex is divided into four basic sections. Five hundred acres lying north of No. 7 and a few acres bordering the southern edge of the highway will be devoted to a self-contained industrial section. Serviced by good roads and railway spur lines, this will be the site of 100 modern industries.

To the south, and separated by a pleasant buffer zone of parkland, will be the Delrex residential section. Gently curved streets, complete with sidewalks and all services, will provide an attractive setting for more than 3,000 homes. Larger executive homes will be built overlooking Silver Creek Valley which will be reserved as a greenbelt and park area. The river will be dammed to create a small lake for the enjoyment of all residents of the Georgetown area.

A 60 acre wedge section at the intersection of the ninth line, or Mountainview Road, and No. 7, will be devoted to a centre for all community activities. The centre will include a huge parking lot, commercial and community offices, recreational facili-

ties and a complete shopping centre. The entire project has been planned to be attractive as well as efficient. School sites have been donated and church sites are available. Delrex will be a community which will help mould Georgetown into a model city.

Nfld. Premier's Father Leaves Daughter Here

The father of Premier Joseph Smallwood of Newfoundland, Charles W. Smallwood, 83, died Thursday in Toronto General Hospital. His daughter, Mrs. Irvine Ernewein is a Georgetown resident at 5A Victoria Street.

Mr. Smallwood was flown to Toronto in January to undergo treatment for a throat ailment. Funeral service and interment will be in New-

foundland. Born in Gambo, Nfld., he started his business life as a lumber surveyor and was the first to build a modern lumber mill at Gambo. He lived most of his life in St. John's, however, where he worked as a government

His father introduced modern advertising in Newfoundland. He manufactured fishing boots and on his arrival from Prince Edward Island where he had a farm, built a large boot, painted it a shiny black and fastened it to an iron rod stuck in the rocks where all fishermen could see it coming into the narrows.

Married to the former Mary Devanna of Newfoundland, he had 13 children. They include six sons, Joseph, Charles, Alexander, Reginald and Augustus, all of St. John's, and Davis of Kitchener; seven daughters, Mrs. Robert White, Mrs. William Green, Mrs. Fred Cook and Mrs. Reginald Collins, all of St. John's; Mrs. Alfred Harris, Kitchener; Mrs. Irvine Ernewein of Georgetown and Mrs. Richard Gadd of Germany.
