A former resident, Herbert (Bert) J. Lucas, 51, was buried in Woodland Cemetery, London, following funeral service this afternoon at the Bennett and Pincombe funeral home in that city.

Mr. Lucas a London florist, died on Sunday in Victoria Hospital after a lengthy illness.

Son of Mrs. Rose Lucas, 35 Victoria Street, and the late Charles Lucas, he was born in Kent, England, and lived in Colborne when the family first emigrated to Canada. He attended school in Georgetown, and learned the florist trade with the old Georgetown Floral Co., operated by the late Sam Kirk. He later worked in Brampton and Amherstburg before going into business for himself in London 24 years ago.

FARM FORUM

Farmers Favour Plan for Workmen's Compensation

On Monday evening, March 12, National Farm Radio Forum dealt with the subject "Workmen's Compensation."

All the farm forums in Halton county agreed that farmers should take advantage of benefits obtainable through workmen's compensation.

This type of insurance offers many advantages to farm workers. It provides medical, surgical, nursing and hospital services for any employee who might be injured during the course of his work. It also provides cash benefits to compensate workers for loss of earnings and a life pension if permanently disabled.

The cost to the farmer is based on the amount of his payroll and his own yearly earnings. In this way the employer is relieved of all liability arising from any accident sustained by his helpers.

The greatest disadvantage is the fact that the farmer cannot secure this protection for himself unless he has paid employees. As a great many just need help for a short time at certain seasons of the year, this has a tendency to increase the cost.

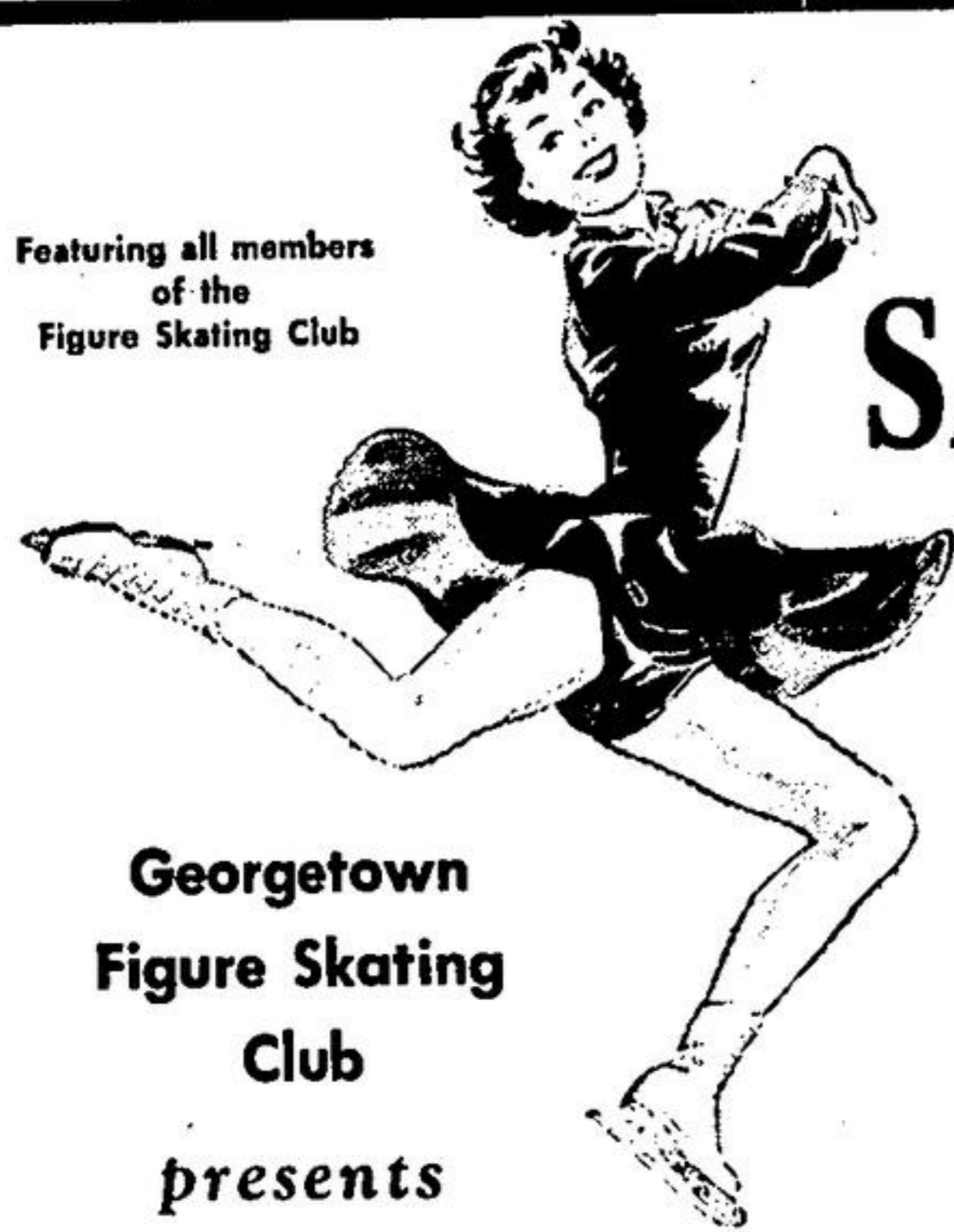
