St. George's Canvas Aims at Triple Budget

For many weeks now a parish budget and canvass committee under the leadership of Sam Penrice, People's Churchwarden at St. George Anglican Church has been meeting and planning a "Loyalty Drive" to strengthen the church, spiritually, numerically, and financially.

The committee is made up of laymen under the chairmanship of Mr. Penrice, with members Charles Harris, Rector's Churchwarden, Thomas Eason, Thomas VanSickler, John Gunning, Jack Hart, has rendered valuable assistance as a financial advisor on the parish budget and literature.

The aim of the campaign is to acquaint all the parish membership with the requirements and difficulties facing the church in the rapid growing community. It is mainly directed at tripling the parish budget in 1956 and meet present outstanding obligations.

One of the immediate needs is a new organ as the present instrument has rendered faithful service and the time has arrived when repairs cannot restore it. A substantial amount towards this cost is being endeavoured in the campaign this year.

Another feature of the Loyalty Drive is inviting the membership to become regular systematic contributors, through the church envelope system, allowing the churchwardens to operate on a sound assured budget. The committee hope that over three hundred sets will come into regular use in 1956.

Intention cards are being distributed throughout the parish and Easter Day, Sunday, April 1st. The Loyalty Intentions will be collected in a large receptacle located in the church. Further canvassing and visitations will continue till April 20th.

On April 15th at Evensong the archdeacon of Trafalgar, the Ven. S. Kirk, L.Th., will dedicate the new carpet and kneelers which are gifts of the congregation, made possible through the Advent Thank-Offering Folders.

On April the 22nd the Sunday nearest to St. George's Day, the Corporation have proclaimed it "Loyalty Sunday" at the 11 a.m. service the wren of the church will conduct Mattins, the Rector will install the officers and all the Intention Cards will be offered to God on the Altar at that service.

The climax of the Loyalty Drive is planned to coincide with the visit of the Bishop the Rt. Rev. W. E. Egan, when he comes for the Apostolic Rite of Holy Confirmation on May 13. At that service the parishioners will be invited to attend and privately consecrate themselves afresh to God's service by pledging their loyalty to Christ and His Church and the Parish Family of St. George's. It will be a devotional spiritual intention by the renewing of their own baptismal and confirmation vows.
