WHAT COUNCIL DID

Commence Highway Work Next Monday

Work on sidewalks and curbs on Guelph St. will start next Monday if weather is favourable.

Town Engineer Douglas Wilson reported to council Monday that he had been in touch with the Guelph firm of Wm. Robinson & Sons which was awarded the contract last fall, and they are planning to recommence work Monday. Sections of the new sidewalk were laid in October, and the advent of winter delayed completion of the work until now.

Questioned about tenders for the paving contract, Mr. Wilson said it is not possible to call for these for a few weeks until a definite starting date is set.

It is 'definite' that the long-awaited new highway will be a reality this year, and Georgetown will have a fine artery through town for the first time in years.

Initial action to purchase a new fire truck was taken with presentation of a by-law calling for debenture borrowing of \$19,950 to pay for it.

Cr. Irwin Noble's property committee was empowered to spend up to \$400 for seeding and rolling the park infield, in preparation for the various summer sporting activities.

County council has been asked to pave Main St. S. from Park Ave to Maple, and Mountainview Rd. in the block between King St. and Maple. These are "connecting links" which it is county responsibility to maintain.

In order to give council better guidance during the year, Mayor Armstrong asked finance minister McGillivray to have quarterly financial statements prepared, so there could be a quarterly review of budget and expenditures.

Roads in the Swanek subdivision were discussed, and Cr. Walter Gray was asked to contact the proper parties to see if action could be speeded up on getting them in proper shape. The roads are most unsatisfactory, Mr. Gray said, with huge water-filled holes.

LESLIE DENISON ONCE COUNCILLOR

Member of an old Toronto family, and a resident of Georgetown for several years, Leslie Fisher Denison died suddenly in Houston, Texas, last Thursday.

Mr. and Mrs. Denison and their family at one time lived at Miradon Farm, now the residence of Mr. and Mrs. D. R. McLaughlin, and later lived on Charles St. where the Harold Marshalls now reside.

He was a prominent member of St. George's Anglican Church where he served as a warden, and was a member of the town council in 1927. The family moved back to the city 25 years ago.

Surviving are his wife Alice and six children, Charlie of Lively, Ont.; Betty, Mrs. A. H. Jeffery, Niagara; Fred of Garden Grove, California; Jane, Mrs. A. W. Truax, St. Paul, Minnesota; Margaret and Bill of Toronto.

The funeral service was held on Monday at the Trull Funeral Home in Toronto and interment was in St. John's Cemetery on the Humber, Weston.
