Rev. G. P. Parson Will Speak To Bible Group



The Rev. G. P. Parson will speak at the annual meeting of the local branch of the British and Foreign Bible Society in Canada, to be held In First Baptist Church on May 8th at 8 p.m. This is an inter-church society and everyone interested in the distribution of bibles throughout the world to everyone in his native tongue will be most welcome to this meeting. "Our Bible", an authentic documentary film telling how the Bible has come down to us through the ages will be shown.

The Bible societies throughout the world, since the founding of the first one a hundred and fifty years ago, have played an important role in missionary endeavour. It is they to whom all foreign missionaries must go for copies of the scriptures in the native languages of the people to whom they minister. Thanks to the labours of these societies, of which the British & Foreign is the oldest, the Bible exists in just over 1,100 languages of the world. However, according to the French Academy of Science, a soher estimate of the number of languages spoken in the world is 2,796. Thus there remains a tremendous task yet to be done. It should be pointed out that all the major languages have been attempted, and the remaining 1,600 languages into which no portion of the scriptures has as yet been published represents the tongues of only a fifth of the population of the globe, and some of these languages are spoken by only a few hundred people. How: ever, the obligation still rests upon Christians to remember these sheep as well as the ninety-and-nine in the fold. Since the founding of the British & Foreign Bible Society in 1804, 615 million bibles have been distributed throughout the world. The principle of distribution is according to a man's ability to pay, so that a large proportion of this number has been sold for only a small fraction of their

It is to create interest in this work, an expression of the missionary effort of the church at large throughout the world, and to collect funds to further it, that the local branch exists here in Georgetown.
