

**Toronto University
Honours OAC Grad
Mr. C. D. Grahman**

In recognition of outstanding service to agriculture, the University of Toronto will confer upon Mr. C. D. Grahman, Deputy Minister of Agriculture for the Province of Ontario, the degree of Doctor of Laws at the annual Convocation, Ontario Agricultural College, May 18th. This is the second LL. D. degree to be conferred at an Ontario Agri-

cultural College Convocation. The former recipient was Dr. E. F. Palmer of Vineland Experiment Station, who received his degree in 1949. Mr. C. D. Grahman is a native of Carlton County, graduating from the O.A.C. in 1929. Following his graduation he was an agricultural representative in the counties of Middlesex, Perth and Peel. From 1941 to 1944, he was on leave of absence to organize the extension program of the Holstein Friesian Association of Canada. He was then appointed Director of Extension for the Ontario Department of Agriculture. In 1946, he became Deputy Minister of Agricul-

ture for the Province of Ontario. As Director of Extension, Mr. Graham was a pioneer in the Ontario Junior Farmer organization, which now has approximately 10,000 members. In his capacity as Deputy Minister of Agriculture, Mr. Graham has established a reputation throughout the province for sympathetic understanding of individual problems, yet strict adherence to the principle of justice and fairness to all concerned. Mr. Graham's contributions to the Agriculture of Ontario in general, and to his alma mater the Ontario Agricultural College in particular, are worthy of his recognition.


**Fraser Funeral
Service Held in
Parry Sound**

Funeral service for John (Gerry) Fraser, 27, of Silvercreek was conducted Saturday in Parry Sound, and four friends from here attended. Bert McMenemy, with whom he was employed at Silvercreek Service Station, was a pallbearer, and Ray Ellis, Al Jennings and Dave Barclay also went north for the service. Mr. Fraser was discovered dead in his car outside the service station last Wednesday morning. He had apparently fallen asleep in his parked car the night before and death resulted from asphyxiation. Death was ruled accidental, when it was discovered that his 1940 model car had holes in the muffler and in the floorboards, and no inquest was deemed necessary by the coroner and investigating provincial police officers. He had resided in the district for some time and was employed with Barclay Haulage before joining Mr. McMenemy's staff. Unmarried, he is survived by his mother and a young brother and sister, Robert and Laura who live on a farm near Parry Sound, and married sisters in Galt and Toronto. He was buried in Foley Township Cemetery.
